The Prayer of the Week

Lord Jesus Christ, You reign among us by the preaching of Your cross. Forgive Your people their offenses that we, being governed by Your bountiful goodness, may enter at last into Your eternal paradise; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

.Welcome to Worship! Today's readings paint a picture of Jesus' kingship which challenges human understanding of what it means to rule as king. The Introit begins, "Let all the earth fear the Lord," but the readings don't present a God who, from a human perspective, is very fearful. In the Old Testament reading, God says to His people, "Your words have been hard against Me," as if their false accusations against God have hurt Him. In the Gospel, Jesus hangs on the cross under a sign which reads, "This is the King of the Jews"—an unusual posture for a king. Paul's words in the Epistle put things in perspective for us: through Jesus' reign as King on the cross, God was reconciling the world to Himself. In the opening hymn, we ask the King to be present with us in worship. In the Hymn of the Day, like the thief in the Gospel reading, we ask our dying King to let His blood cover our sins. In the sending hymn, we pray that our King would come quickly and bring us to our home in heaven with Him.
