Welcome to Worship! Today's readings focus on the importance of the Word of God, and how unique it truly is. The Introit says "Your Word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my path"—telling us that God's Word is a guide for our lives. In the Old Testament reading, the Word of the Lord comes to Abraham that Sarah will have a son—showing us the power of God's Word to bring the seemingly impossible into being. In the Gospel, Mary ponders on the words of Jesus, the "the good portion, which will not be taken away from her"—reminding us that God's Word is the most important thing in our lives. In the Epistle, Paul encourages his readers not to shift from the hope of the Gospel that they had heard in the Word. In the collect, we pray for the Spirit so we might hear the Word and through it, learn to know the one thing needful.

Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper in which He feeds us with His body and blood. The Lutheran Church recognizes the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in this Sacrament, and we ask all who attend the Sacrament to share this faith with us. Members of our sister congregations in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are welcome to commune. If you are a guest and want to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor or an elder before the Service prior to communing.

When he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them and bowed himself to the earth ³and said, "O Lord, if I have found favor in your sight, do not pass by your servant. ⁴Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree, ⁵while I bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on—since you have come to your servant." Colossians 1:21-29

The Words of Our Lord

P Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My T body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My T blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Proclamation of Christ

P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

P O Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, in giving us Your body and blood to eat and to drink, You lead us to remember and confess Your holy cross and passion, Your blessed death, Your rest in the tomb, Your resurrection from the dead, Your ascension into heaven, and Your coming for the final judgment.
