#### **The Eighth Sunday after Pentecost**

August 3, 2025

**Welcome to Worship!** Today's readings all touch upon the concept of treasure, and the impact that treasure has on our relationship with God. In the Introit, the Psalmist states that God will provide the costly price of ransoming his soul. The collect prays that we receive God's "wisdom to recognize the treasures You have stored up for us in heaven." The Old Testament reading speaks of the futility of acquiring earthly treasure. The Gospel brings up the peril of lacking heavenly treasure. The Epistle enjoins us to keep our minds on heaven where our true treasure is stored.

Today's worship challenges you to examine what you really treasure in this world. Can a person tell that God is first place in your life by looking at the portion of earthly treasure you return to Him? Do you always place the value of your salvation above the tinsel and glitter of earthly fortune? Do you have the wisdom to recognize the treasures God has stored up for you? Sinful people can only answer, "Sadly, no."

The Good News is that a Man by the name of Jesus emptied Himself of His treasures and died and rose again so that we could be forgiven caretakers of the treasure trove of all God's blessings. Let the joy of that thought fill you as we repent, believe, and then go out and live as forgiven caretakers.

**Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper** in which He feeds us with His body and blood. The Lutheran Church recognizes the real presence of the body and blood of Christ in this Sacrament, and we ask all who attend the Sacrament to share this faith with us. Members of our sister congregations in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are welcome to commune. **If you are a guest and want to receive the Sacrament, please speak with the pastor or an elder before the Service prior to communing.** 

If you wish to receive the common cup instead of an individual glass, place your hand across your chest. At the center of the communion tray, there are glasses with a reduced amount of wine for those who don't wish to have as much wine when they commune. Please indicate your attendance at communion by signing the communion registration sheet on the desk by the outer door.

We have gluten-free communion wafers for those who need them. Please speak to the pastor prior to the service if you wish to receive them. To indicate you would like a gluten-free wafer, please hold up two fingers (like the peace sign) as the wafers are distributed.



Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-26

<sup>2</sup>Vanity of vanities, says the Preacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity. . . .

<sup>12</sup>I the Preacher have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. <sup>13</sup>And I applied my heart to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven. It is an unhappy business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. <sup>14</sup>I have seen everything that is done under the sun, and behold, all is vanity and a striving after wind. . . .

<sup>18</sup>I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me, <sup>19</sup>and who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity. <sup>20</sup>So I turned about and gave my heart up to despair over all the toil of my labors under the sun, <sup>21</sup>because sometimes a person who has toiled with wisdom and knowledge and skill must leave everything to be enjoyed by someone who did not toil for it. This also is vanity and a great evil. <sup>22</sup>What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? <sup>23</sup>For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

<sup>24</sup>There is nothing better for a person than that he should eat and drink and find enjoyment in his toil. This also, I saw, is from the hand of God, <sup>25</sup>for apart from him who can

eat or who can have enjoyment? <sup>26</sup>For to the one who pleases him God has given wisdom and knowledge and joy, but to the sinner he has given the business of gathering and collecting, only to give to one who pleases God. This also is vanity and a striving after wind.

C I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.




#### **Proclamation of Christ**


- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.


