"And He shall be their peace." That is how the prophet Micah described the coming Messiah. God's people will not find their peace in a big bank account. Nor will our peace be found in our living good and upright lives. Our peace is found in the Messiah, in Jesus, in the Good Shepherd whose strength is the Lord. Mary's circumstances were difficult; the angel's announcement of her pregnancy had to be quite a surprise. Pondering all these things in her heart, she found peace in God, who blessed her. So she sang God's praises, a song that we sing still today, the Magnificat, a powerful reminder that "He shall be their peace."
