AN UPDATE FROM APACHE YOUTH MINISTRIES

As you have seen in recent bulletins, we're actively collecting donations for the 5 ministries we help support while they serve the Apache tribe in Whiteriver, Arizona. (See the list below.). In a recent conversation with Josh Brock, Director of Apache Youth Ministries on February 13, he relayed to me that the tribal chairwoman lifted the lock down of the reservation with some restrictions. Some of you have asked when I'll be going out there again. My plan, so far, is to be there sometime during spring break. Please place your donated items in the AYM box in the fellowship hall by Wednesday, March 9th.

Items always needed new or clean gently used:

- 1. Clothing sizes new born to adult (bagged marked either children or adult)
- 2. Twin sized bed linens & blankets. Towels & wash cloths (bagged marked linens)
- 3. Disposable diapers (even one or two that might be left from a size your child outgrew)
- 4. Baby formula (even sample packets that you received but never opened)
- 5. Motel sized toiletries
- 6. Devotional pamphlets or books (both children's and adult)
- 7. Jigsaw puzzles any size or reading material (for the elder home)

And if you like to knit, crochet or sew:

- 8. Bibs of all sizes are always needed (Bagged marked children)
- 9. Baby blankets (each baby is sent to foster care with their own blanket to keep) (Bagged marked children)
