### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### FAMILY LIFE CENTER FUND DRIVE AS OF NOVEMBER 7th

Since kicking off our campaign to raise \$1.3 Million in cash or pledges over the next three years, we have received pledges amounting to \$337,660 from 17 families/individuals. Our current balance in the Texas District Church Expansion fund is \$470,696.20. The account is earning over \$600/month. Therefore, we have \$808,356.20 in cash and pledges making us well on our way to reaching our goal of \$1.3 Million.
