# **Convention Personalities**

### **Worship Leaders**

**Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison** is proclaimer for the Thursday opening worship service. In his third term as president of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS), he serves as the chief ecclesiastical officer of the LCMS, supervising the doctrine taught and practiced, representing the LCMS with its partner church bodies throughout the world, and overseeing all officers, executives, and agencies of the LCMS. Harrison encourages the women of the LWML to be who they are called to be — Christian women in today's world. Harrison and his wife, Kathy, are members of Village Lutheran Church in Ladue, Missouri, where he serves as assistant pastor. They have two sons, Matthew and Mark.

**Rev. Allen D. Anderson,** president of the LCMS Rocky Mountain District, is proclaimer for the Sunday worship service. Anderson is passionate about the district's vision of Mercy, Witness, and Life Together. He also works to maintain unity in doctrine, and provides ecclesiastical supervision to congregations and rostered workers in the Rocky Mountain District. He supports congregations in the call process and provides leadership and direction for the district staff. Before becoming president, Anderson held numerous offices in the district. He also continues to serve as pastor of Mt. Zion Lutheran Church and School in Boulder, Colorado.



Ida Mall, Lutheran Women's Missionary League President, 1991–1995, continues to serve and mentor the women of the LWML. She previously served the LCMS through the Board for District and Congregational Services, the Board for Missions, and the Outreach Task Force. She has received the Christus Primus award from Concordia University, Ann Arbor. Mall often says, "If it doesn't have anything to do with your salvation (or someone else's salvation,) don't worry about it." She actively seeks opportunities to share her faith in Jesus with others and makes that focus her personal mission statement. Her joy is encouraging young people or just giving them a hug.

### Bible Study Leader

Deaconess Betty Knapp served as parish deaconess for 37 years at Redeemer Lutheran Church, Marquette, Michigan, until her recent retirement in 2016. Through her mother's involvement in LWML, Knapp saw the importance of service and Bible study in the life of a Christian and says it was through LWML where she was introduced to deaconess ministry. Knapp has served in a variety of positions for LCMS and LWML and brings her personal focus to her Bible study: place the emphasis not on her or her surroundings, but on God alone. She says trusting in Him and in the goodness of His ways and purposes for her life gives her comfort, assurance, and strength for everyday living.

### **Humorous Interrupter**

Jan Struck brings a fresh approach to the journey of faith and uses her sense of humor as she shares her life with fellow travelers and leaves them laughing. Her trust and faith in Christ is her reason to make a joyful noise unto God. ### Song Leader

**Wendysue Fluegge** is a gifted musician/songwriter who loves putting faith stories and Scripture to melody. God has given her a unique full time ministry where she partners with hundreds of churches and organizations all across the country. With a passionate heart for Jesus and people, Wendysue boldly converses with anyone, anywhere, about spiritual things, and is always *ready to give an answer for the hope she has* (1 Peter 3:15). Based out of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Fluegge lives with her husband of 20 years and their two teenagers.

### Mites in Action Speakers

**Steve Cohen,** founder of The Apple of His Eye Mission Society in Georgetown, Texas, and his wife **Nancy**, bring wit, years of experience on the mission fields in Israel and Russia, and a passion to see women involved in community and outreach. They consider it part of their mission to inspire women everywhere to share their knowledge of God's Word and are thrilled to be in partnership with LWML in Bringing the Gospel to the Lost Sheep of Israel, 2015–2017 Mission Grant #14.

**Sanya Parson** serves as Director of Rebecca's Garden of Hope. Parson developed a training template for other organizations to use to develop their own tutoring and mentoring programs for at risk youth. She coordinates a national network of resources to support these partner programs around the country. Parson takes great joy in promoting lasting relationships with parents and youth so that lives can be impacted, one child at a time. 2013–2015 Mission Grant #13, Christ-Centered Tutoring through Rebecca's Garden of Hope.

**Vicar Tim Norton,** Lutheran Indian Ministries, brings experience in church planting and evangelism from his service as a missionary in Africa and the United States during the last 18 years. Serving at Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in Navajo, New Mexico, since 2013, Norton shares the Word of God with the Navajo people and says Native Americans can often be a forgotten people group in our own backyard, but by God's grace the LWML has not forgotten the Navajo. 2015–2017 Mission Grant #6, Hope and Healing to the Navajo People – Rocky Mountain District.

Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) in Lebanon, locally called Middle East Lutheran Ministry (MELM), is using \$72,000 in LWML grant funds to turn around a cycle of poverty and psychological trauma in the lives of many refugee women and their families. Born in a war zone in Lebanon, **Katia Sahyouni** says her childhood was spent running from the war and escaping bombs. She has seen people killing each other, but knowing that Jesus shed His life in order to save others was the motivation to commit her life and heart to Him and to serve Him as long as she lives. Her outreach includes ministry to students, refugees, youth, orphans, and various ethnic groups. 2015–2017 Mission Grant #7, Outreach in Refugee Camps – Lebanon.

### Missionaries

**Rebecca Schaff,** missionary for The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Minneapolis, Minnesota, organizes opportunities for interaction and cultural exchange between domestic and international students who attend the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis. She seeks to build relationships and directs students to University Lutheran Chapel for Bible study, worship services, spiritual growth, formal catechesis, and fellowship opportunities.

### **Convention Personalities**

**Rev. Carl and Chenhsi (Li) Hanson**, career missionaries for The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in the Asia region, are based in Hong Kong. He connects local churches and schools, creating a link for Asian Lutheran mission outreach in the Asia region. He is also part of the Asia Management Team for the LCMS which supports the Asia region through joint planning and budgeting. Chenhsi serves as the children's ministry coordinator for The Church of All Nations in Hong Kong and as a freelance translator.

### Saturday Special Interest Luncheon Speakers

**Steve and Nancy Cohen,** Apple of His Eye Ministry. He has authored and published numerous articles and books. He has been on numerous radio and TV programs addressing the urgent need to bring the Gospel to the over 6 million unsaved Jewish people in North America and now in Israel. She is a published freelance journalist for periodicals and newspapers and speaks Russian and Hebrew. She says LWML has a hands-on approach to missions along with a godly fervor to engage the Gospel worldwide.

Gloria Edwards and Linda Reiser, Lutheran World Relief. Lutheran Women's Missionary League President, 1995–1999, Edwards believes the LWML encourages every woman to understand herself as a gifted person and then to use her gifts to make a difference. Lutheran Women's Missionary League President, 2003–2007, Reiser appreciated witnessing firsthand the amazing "mighty Mite Box" donations from the women of the church and the way missions and missionaries have made an eternal difference throughout the world.

**Rev. Kevin Robson,** LCMS National Mission and International Mission and Missionaries. Robson says he was blessed to serve as an LWML zone counselor early in his ministry and enjoyed parishes with an LWML presence. His personal philosophy is he wakes up thankful and rejoicing every day. Robson will be joined by Missionaries Rebecca Schaff and Rev. Carl Hanson to share stories from the mission field.

**Vicar Tim Norton,** Lutheran Indian Ministries, serves the Navajo in New Mexico. He is currently enrolled at the Cross-Cultural Ministry Center (CMC), a joint program at Concordia University, Irvine, California, which will lead to ordination in conjunction with Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He says LWML has blessed his family's lives and ministry and credits God using the LWML to save the life of his son while the family was serving in Africa.

**Donna Pyle,** Author, Bible study presenter, and founder of Artesian Ministries. Pyle has partnered with LWML on several DVD-based Bible studies, including the newest, *Peter ... from Fisherman to Fisher of Men*, which is being released at this convention. Pyle's devotional journal, *A Sparrow's Worth*, explores a woman's value in Christ, and her series of eight downloadable Bible studies are available for individual or small group use.

Rev. Dr. Gregory P. Seltz, Speaker of The Lutheran Hour® radio program, a position he has held since February 2011. Seltz's involvement in LWML started early on in his ministry with service as counselor. He says he's learned that if the Lord wants something done, it will get done. If He doesn't, often that will become clear too. Even in the midst of difficulties, whether in life or ministry, peace and hope can always be found in our Lord Jesus Christ.















# **Convention Rules**

### 1. Credentials

- a. The Convention Registrar shall report to the Recording Secretary, directly after the opening ceremonies, the number of delegates registered as present with proper credentials, and the Recording Secretary shall make supplementary reports to the convention when required as a result of a change in the registration rolls.
- b. A member registered as an alternate may be transferred from alternate status to delegate at any time during the continuance of business meetings by presenting the request to the Recording Secretary. Upon clearance, the Convention Registrar shall make the official adjustments to the voting rolls and the newly certified delegate shall retain the position through the remainder of the convention.
- c. Delegates must wear the identification badges issued by the Convention Registrar for seating in the delegate section.

### 2. Seating

- a. Delegates shall be seated together in sections reserved for them.
- b. Delegates are requested to be in their seats five minutes before the time set for the opening of meetings.

### 3. Conduct of Business

- a. The President shall appoint a committee of three members to approve the convention minutes.
- b. Only registered delegates and other voting members of the convention may introduce business, debate, and vote.
- c. A motion offered from the floor must be presented to the Recording Secretary in writing, signed by the maker.
- d. Speakers from the floor must use one of the microphones and give name and title or district in order to be recognized.
- e. Discussion is limited to two (2) minutes for each speaker. No one may speak more than twice on a question unless consent is granted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates.
- f. Voting by electronic ballot is authorized.

### 4. Communications

a. All communications for officers and members of the assembly shall be delivered by pages.

- b. At the chair's discretion only urgent announcements will be made from the dais. Others will be posted at the Message Center.
- c. Only the President and/or Public Relations Director may authorize official LWML news releases concerning convention business.
- d. No literature may be distributed in the convention rooms or assembly hall without permission of the Executive Committee.
- e. All cell phones are to be turned off or turned to vibrate.

### 5. Photographs

- a. It is requested that no photos be taken during worship services and other devotional periods.

### In Memoriam

### Elizabeth "Betty" Duda | LWML President 1987-1991



Come to me ... and I will give you rest (Matthew 11:28).

"When we talk about serving the Lord with gladness — and I always add 'and joy' — that's how it is in the LWML. We are a mission organization. We're dedicated to the Great Commission. When you are doing that, you are developing leadership." Those words emphasizing LWML's theme were shared years ago by Past President Dr. Elizabeth "Betty" Duda during an interview for an article for *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly*.

International LWML President from 1987–1991, Betty passed into the arms of Jesus on December 24, 2016, at the age of 84. Betty also served her Lord as the LWML Florida-Georgia District President and ILWML Mission Projects Director. She determined early in her term that everything would be done for only one reason — to glorify the Lord. Secondly, she wanted the LWML to become a stronger faith and service organization that would attract and better represent all Lutheran women.

Betty was a strong encourager who saw not problems, but opportunities. Her daughter Elizabeth said, "She was a role model and helped mentor others because she wanted to pass that legacy on and help show that you can really make a difference."

Betty served as president of many groups, including being the first woman elected to the board of Concordia University, Bronxville, New York, where she served as chairman for five years. She completed terms as chair with many other Lutheran and civic groups and served on numerous boards including The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod; several Concordia Universities; Mill Neck School for the Deaf, Lutheran Friends of the Deaf; POBLO (People of the Book Lutheran Outreach); and Reedy Creek Improvement District (Disney World).

Many will remember Betty not only for her inspiring leadership, but also for her humble service as evidenced by the foot washing she and other officers performed for all the attendees at the 1988 Assembly of Leaders. Betty said, "My greatest obstacle over the years has been convincing people that I just wanted to serve the Lord. I had no agenda, no political motivation at all. Everything I've done is to serve."



Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and he will make straight your paths (Proverbs 3:5 RSV).

### Joy Dougherty

Joy Dougherty, Toledo, Ohio, died after a valiant fight with cancer on August 30, 2015, and is home in the arms of her Savior, Jesus. Joy was born on April 8, 1941. She was a baptized child of God and a pastor's daughter.

Joy served as LWML Recording Secretary from 2013 until her death. Joy previously served her Lord at the local LWML level, as president and vice president of the zone, chairman of the district nominating committee, LWML Ohio District President, and mission editor of the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly*.

Joy once shared, "My prayer is that LWML will continue to fill each woman with the eagerness and enthusiasm to grow spiritually, to support missions, and to be an ambassador for our Lord and Savior in word and deed wherever she is placed." She would have wanted to be remembered as a woman of faith who loved her husband and family dearly, treasured her Lutheran education, and who lived a life of service to her Lord and to her profession.

Joy is survived by her husband John, three children, and seven grandchildren.

### 1. Completion of Lukonda Lutheran School Buildings, Uganda – Lutheran Church Uganda \$48,000

This grant will complete Phase II of construction of two schools in Kayunga District, Uganda. Between 100 and 200 children, ages 4 to 12, will be educated in these schools. The villages of Kakiika and Lukonda will provide bricks and land for the school, with Resurrection Lutheran Church and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Southeastern District supporting the remaining costs of labor and materials. When complete, each of the two school buildings will have four classrooms. Two of the classrooms in one building will also be used for weekly Lutheran worship services. This grant will enable completion of the school building complex begun in 2012.

# 2. Providing Food and the Gospel to Starving Children – Mercy Meals of Siouxland \$40,000

Jesus gives the same command today, to feed the hungry, that He gave His disciples. Mercy Meals of Siouxland, a ministry of Faith Lutheran Church, Sioux City, Iowa, began packaging fortified rice/soy meals in 2012. Mercy Meals donates all packaged meals to Orphan Grain Train for transportation and delivery to Christian organizations in many countries, including India, Haiti, Romania, and Ecuador, as well as to Navajo reservations in the Southwest and Ysleta Mission in El Paso, Texas. Children and families receive food and hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. An LWML grant will feed from 50,000 to 75,000 hungry children.

# 3. Lutheran Children's Books for Families Worldwide – Lutheran Heritage Foundation \$100,000

Lutheran churches, missionaries, and new Christian families around the world will be provided with Bible story books, translated into their languages that teach children about Jesus. These brightly illustrated books, such as *A Child's Garden of Bible Stories* and *Bible Stories in Pictures*, are given free of charge to the parents and missionaries who need them.

# 4. Christian Hope Through Mass Media in Egypt – Lutheran Hour Ministries \$100,000

Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) has over 60 years of experience proclaiming the Gospel via mass media in the Middle East. Fortunately, the political climate in Egypt provides a new opportunity to expand ministry in the region. Other parts of the Middle East, however, are experiencing great turmoil with war and, as a result, refugees, mainly women and children, are fleeing to safety. There is urgency to expand their proclamation of the Gospel in these areas, especially refugee camps in Lebanon, Jordan, and Turkey. LHM will reach families, refugees, and citizens of the region through a new television program broadcast in Cairo, Egypt. This new television broadcast has the potential to reach millions of people throughout the Middle East, refugees and

citizens alike, with the message of faith and the true love of Christ and to be a strong Christian voice and witness through Arabic satellite television programming.

### 5. Laborers of Love - Lutheran Braille Workers \$100,000

Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) has been providing God's Word to the visually impaired since 1943, utilizing the New International Version of the Bible for the past 25 years. With the use of the English Standard Version (ESV) by the LCMS, LBW desires to offer people with visual disability the opportunity to worship and study with the same translation of the Bible as sighted people of the Church. These funds will assist in the cost of the production of the zinc plates for each Braille Work Center along with producing the ESV Bible in large print.

# 6. Education Loan Repayment Assistance Grants – MinistryFocus \$100,000

Twenty called church workers, each year during the biennium, will each receive a grant of \$2,500 through MinistryFocus, an LCMS Recognized Service Organization (RSO), to assist in repayment of educational loans accrued in preparing for service to the Lord through the church. Repayment of educational debt is often made more difficult by the very modest salaries of church workers. This problem may affect recruitment, performance, and retention of church workers.

### 7. Fairmount Coffee House Outreach Ministry – Lutheran Student Center, Wichita, Kansas \$100,000

The Lutheran Student Center (LSC) of Wichita, Kansas, is a campus ministry under the guidance of the University Lutheran Ministry Association (ULMA). This area of the city has seen some urban decay over the last several years and Wichita State University has taken on the challenge of bringing renewal to the area. The Fairmount Coffee House will be situated directly across the street from the new campus expansion called "Innovation Campus." This will be an interconnected community where organizations establish operations and utilize the university's vast resources. There are no other coffee houses in the area and the Fairmount Coffee House will provide an environment where the love of Christ is felt as you walk in the door. Walls will be decorated with Scripture quotes and staff will share the Gospel with students and guests. Students are working hard to raise funds for this project and are seeking grants from other organizations.

# 8. RECONNECT to the Body of Christ, Circuit 28 - Texas District \$50,000

The congregations of Texas District Circuit 28 have a great desire to work together as one group in training mission workers to share the Word and unite these congregations and communities. The Rio Grande Valley of Texas shares the

border with Mexico and has a large Hispanic population, many of whom are among the poorest of poor, at risk and unchurched. They have developed a long-range plan to assist the struggling congregations in reaching out to the communities to bring the Word into the homes of hurting families. The first step in the plan has been realized with the arrival of a Director of Christian Education (DCE) that will be serving the circuit – not just an individual church. With this in place, the next stages can begin by training leaders within the congregations in a mission and ministry model utilized by a local, thriving congregation, building campus relationships with the 50,000 students attending local colleges, and conducting community mercy projects. These funds will assist in the project startup costs, training materials, transportation costs, scholarships, and other incurred expenses of the training program.

### 9. Reformation Continues: Lectionaries in West Africa – Lutheran Bible Translators \$108,800

Following the words of Martin Luther, "I wish that this book alone, in all languages, would live in the hands, eyes, ears, and hearts of all people (LW 48.356)," this project focuses on translating Old Testament texts for the three-year lectionary series into three languages in Cameroon and Ghana, West Africa. New Testament translations already are completed. When completed, these lectionaries will enable the use of mother tongue Scriptures in the church.

### 10. Training Lutheran Middle Eastern Missionaries – Biblical Orthodox Lutheran Mission \$93.000

The mission of the Biblical Orthodox Lutheran Mission (BOLM) is a ministry primarily to Arabic-speaking peoples and Muslims in particular. They bring the Good News of salvation through their teaching and by the power of the Holy Spirit. BOLM's outreach impacts lives in the United States and in the Middle East. They educate and disciple new believers and, as the Lord wills, commission them as missionaries. They need funds to support their internet seminary for two years; acquire Bibles in various languages for distribution, acquire and distribute copies of *Luther's Small Catechism* in Arabic, and for expenses for phone and internet.

### 11. "Set To Serve" - Voice of Care \$100,000

The mission of Voice of Care is to equip the Church to nurture people with disabilities and their caregivers in their walk with Christ, training ministry workers and lay volunteers to serve at their own congregations, and in the community. These volunteers share Jesus' love through church and community site programming and special needs camps. Workshops teach how a congregation can provide help by offering inclusive worship, adaptive Christian Education, short-term respite programs, disability awareness days, volunteer-led "Jesus time" in residential or daycare facilities,

and Vacation Bible School. Grant funds would be used for webinars and videos, as well as workshops.

### 12. Student Leadership Training Conferences -Lutheran Campus Mission Association \$30,000

Lutheran Campus Mission Association (LCMA) is seeking funds to initiate additional Campus Ministry Leadership Conferences in three new regions. The gathering has been effective in providing disciple-building and leader development to members of various campus ministries. Prior conferences have led a significant number of alumni to enter a church work profession. This grant will fully fund up to three new regional conferences for two years, after which ministries in each region will fund the events with registration fees and support as needed from LCMA and private donors.

### 13. Training Teachers for Today's Learners – Lutheran Special Education Ministries \$100,000

Recognizing that well-equipped teachers can best serve students who have special learning needs to "do all things through Christ," this grant would provide additional education for special education teachers as well as effective tools, supplies, and appropriate technology for use in the daily classroom. The iCAN after-school programs and summer sessions also provide community outreach in a Christ-centered area with exposure to God's love for perhaps the first time.

# 14. Mercy House for Women and Children – Franklin Avenue Mission, Flint, Michigan \$100,000

The Franklin Avenue Mission in Flint, Michigan, has purchased a residence next door to the mission, and is seeking funds to redesign, renovate, refurbish, and furnish the residence. Named Mercy House for Women and Children, the facility will house six to eight homeless, pregnant, and/ or abused women and their children. Located in one of the poorest cities in America, the home will attempt to break the cycle of poverty and decrease the potential for abuse, by housing women and children in a safe, caring, Christian environment, where the best practices of parenting and relationship building can be modeled and taught.

# 15. Sharing Jesus with People with Disabilities – Bethesda Lutheran Communities \$100,000

Bethesda Lutheran Communities desires to enhance the lives of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities with services that share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Operating at program locations across the United States, they provide homes and support, promoting awareness and advocating for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Over 1,900 people at 300 program sites in 13 states are served. Travel is essential in achieving this mission. Costs are not subject to state reimbursement when faith supports

are at the heart of the mission. Relying on the support of donors, Bethesda is able to nourish relationships and grow their network to support people of all abilities with their faith journey. Grant funds would be used to support ministry consultant travel.

# 16. Restoration Programs for Native Hawaiians – Lutheran Indian Ministries \$75,000

Most people think of Hawaii as paradise, but to Native Hawaiians, Kanaka, it is quite a different place. In recent years, the number of homeless people in Hawaii has grown, with poverty rising, leaving few people in the middle class. Most of the ministry work is done in urban areas by non-Kanaka men and women to non-Kanaka people. To successfully engage the Kanaka people in the Christian faith and to provide the support and assistance that Kanaka people need to begin to overcome the serious social issues that plague them, missionaries must embrace the Kanaka culture. Clarence DeLude III (Kanaka), who is on staff with Lutheran Indian Ministries, is enrolled in the Cross-Cultural Ministry Center Program at Concordia University, Irvine, California, which leads to ordination. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, Clarence, a Native Hawaiian will be used as God's instrument in bringing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to his fellow Kanaka people. Grant funds would be used for scholarships for Clarence, VBS/Teen Camp, on-going Bible study, and Sexual Abuse and Leadership Training (SALT) seminars.

# 17. Family Scholarships for Short Term Mission Trips – MOST Ministries \$60,000

MOST Ministries has been meeting the physical needs of people around the world as a way to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Through connections with LCMS missionaries and Lutheran church leaders, MOST is building churches and schools, providing health care, and teaching marketable skills, all the while sharing the love of Christ and the Gospel of our Lord. MOST feels it is important to recruit families into mission work not only because of the positive impact it has on the lives of those they serve, but on the families themselves. Serving as a family opens the eyes of their children to see how other people live and gives them a perspective of how fortunate they are in the United States. We are all aware of the increasing costs of travel. This grant will help to offset the expenses of approximately 50% of a typical trip. When the families return, they will share their experiences with their churches, communities, district, and the women of the LWML.

# 18. Expanding the Broadcast of Worship for Shut-Ins – Lutheran Ministries Media, Inc. \$80,000

Lutheran Ministries Media seeks to reach a rapidly aging society with the life-saving message of the Gospel through

the weekly broadcast ministry of Worship for Shut-ins. Their desire is to dramatically increase the reach of this broadcast throughout the United States as well as the world through the means of solidifying the on-air broadcast time on a new major cable or network station and internet streaming of television broadcast. These funds will assist the ministry over the two-year period in expenses and allow the programs to become self-sufficient.

# 19. Equipping Youth to Witness for Life - Y4Life - Lutherans for Life \$25,000

Y4Life seeks to equip young people to be the voices for life in a culture that glorifies the choice of death. The need is especially true for teens, college students, and young adults who are bombarded with secular life styles that are contrary to God's wonderful plan for life. Currently, the Y4Life program is serving college campuses. The mission grant funds will go directly towards expanding the initiative to include Lutheran high school campuses. By training student leaders and providing ongoing mentorship and support for the individual campus ministries, they can raise their voices for life.

# 20. Forming International Teachers and Leaders – Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri \$100,000

Over the past years, Concordia Seminary's Graduate School has seen an increase in the number of international students seeking advanced theological degrees with the full intent of returning to their respective home countries to become teachers and church leaders. This advanced training will have a considerable impact on spreading the Gospel in their countries and will enable them to raise up the next generation of pastors and church leaders.

### 21. Tanzanian Sewing Center – Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT) \$25,000

In southeastern Tanzania, many young women from villages do not attend school or have jobs, and so seek unskilled jobs in larger towns, often ending up involved in prostitution. Some end up with AIDS or unexpected pregnancies, with no means of supporting themselves. The ELCT has established the Bishop Makala Sewing Center to teach young women sewing, life skills, and the Gospel. The ELCT goal is to build classrooms with a 50 student capacity, along with a dormitory. Within one year of training, their sewing skills enable women to have pocket money, purchase a sewing machine, and buy materials to create sewn items to sell for income.

### 22. Christian Eldercare Home in Haiti - Ministry in Mission \$100,000

Haiti is a nation in need of special attention. Since the earthquake in 2010, Lutheran baptisms in Haiti have been multiplied beyond expectations and Lutheran church attendance is increasing. However physical and spiritual needs

of our brothers and sisters in Christ are left unmet. A center for the elderly people who have outlived their families, and some of whom are currently living in tents and deplorable conditions, is planned to be built on the same property where an orphanage was constructed in 2014. The children will have grandparents and the elderly will have children to make them smile. The center, built with funds supplied by this grant, would result in a dwelling with clean water, suitable waste containment, beds, food, and care for these forgotten people. Ministry in Mission desires to fulfill the intent of creating a true community for Haitian Lutherans by providing a safe living environment for all Haitians in the surrounding area and particularly the forgotten elderly society.

# 23. Raising Pastors and Deaconesses – Evangelical Lutheran Church of Liberia \$97,000

Prior to the civil conflict of 1990, there were several Bible colleges/seminaries across the country. Some are yet to be opened and none are Lutheran. The civil war has increased the level of economic hardship in the country, making it difficult for those who may want to study outside of Liberia. In addition, fees charged by other colleges and seminaries outside of Liberia are extremely high. The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Liberia has decided to build a Lutheran Bible College for its 137 congregations and for those from neighboring Sierra Leone and Guinea. The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Liberia believes strongly in the need to witness to our Lutheran confession in a nation that predominately preaches and practices work righteousness over and against justification by grace through faith alone. This grant will provide all the necessary funds to build the college/ seminary with the people of the church supplying the labor.

### 24. Current Missionary Need - LCMS International Mission \$100,000

With fervent, sustained support of LCMS mission projects, Mission Central, located in Mapleton, Iowa, seeks to serve as an avenue for continued support for missionaries throughout the world to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. This grant would provide for a variety of necessary missionary resources such as orientation and training, language training, transportation to and in the country of service and on furlough, various types of insurance, housing, medical care, utilities, and education of missionary children, to name a few.

### 25. Lutheran World Relief Quilt and Kit Shipping Fund \$80,000

Every year, many Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) groups and individuals join their hearts and hands in sewing mission quilts, making blankets, and assembling personal care, baby care, school, and fabric kits to be distributed to people in need through Lutheran World Relief (LWR). Delivering these materials to people in need is a long and sometimes complex process, involving trucking and rail transportation, warehousing, processing, and overseas

shipping. This grant to LWR's Quilt and Shipping Fund ensures the ability to deliver more than 35,500 quilts each year to our neighbors in need around the world and sustains the ministry that so many LWML members have been a part of for generations.

# 26. NOLA 4H: Hearts for the Hungry, Homeless, and Hurting – Christian Families United for Progress \$100,000

Hurricane Katrina was the largest residential disaster in United States history. Twelve years later there is no more federal aid, and many inner-city communities are still hurting. New Orleans has the third highest homeless rate in the nation with 1,700 homeless persons every night, much of this due to the hurricane and loss of homes. Entire neighborhoods were wiped out. Many residents lost friends and family and still suffer from loneliness and depression. Six inner-city LCMS churches, their pastors, leaders, and members have come together to serve Christ by serving their neighbors and providing food and shelter. The NOLA 4H churches work closely with other organizations to support various outreach ministries such as food banks, clothing, toiletries, Bibles, prayer books, counseling, and clinics. Funds will go towards these ministries and equipping each of the fellowship halls in the six churches to serve more people.

# 27. Libraries and Literacy in China – Concordia Welfare & Education Foundation \$88,890

Concordia Welfare and Education Foundation (CWEF) is a non-profit organization based in Hong Kong that was started by The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) and has been working there independently for over 15 years. Here, and in other parts of China, they partner with communities to implement programs in the areas of public health and education. Many areas in China have large underserved populations with children that become left behind when their parents move to other provinces. CWEF partners with schools to provide resources for teaching rural students to read and to practice healthy habits. Many years are spent working in the community and establishing bonds of trust with the people and their leaders by supporting schools and health clinics. The Holy Spirit is working all the time, and many have experienced the love of Christ in word and deed from CWEF staff and volunteers.

# 28. Christ for Veterans and Their Families - LCMS Ministry of the Armed Forces \$27,750

Funds requested by the Ministry to the Armed Forces (MAF) will be utilized to host national training events for Operation Barnabas, an extension of MAF, which provides a network of care through trained congregations that want to reach out to members of the military, their families, and the veterans in their congregations and communities.

### 29. Christ's Care for Children: Kenya – LCMS Office of International Mission \$60,000

Through primary boarding school facilities operated by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Kenya and a secondary school and college scholarship program, vulnerable children have the opportunity to complete school while living at a home away from home. A Christ-centered, caring, and safe environment provides each pupil with education, Scripture engagement, catechesis, and worship. An LWML grant to Christ's Care for Children: Kenya will support 25 students for a two-year period, providing lodging, meals, school fees and related school expenses, medical care, adult oversight, tutoring, emotional support, and spiritual care free of cost to the child or their family.

### 30. Prison and Jail Ministry Synod-wide Conference in 2018 \$36,500

One of the largest needs in Prison and Jail Ministry is not only the offering of Word and Sacrament ministry to those incarcerated, but also in assisting the person when he or she returns to the community. The Prison and Jail Ministry Conference enables over 200 lay and clergy participants from 30 of our LCMS districts to learn about the importance of prison and jail ministry as well as networking with one another for best practices and support of each other in a very difficult mission and ministry. A number of LCMS districts are already doing, or are starting up a Prison and Jail Ministry, and a Synod-wide conference will allow these to continue and expand as changes and new developments continue in the federal and state criminal justice systems. Grant funds would help pay for the expenses involved in hosting a conference.

# 31. Thanking Former Missionaries – LCMS Office of International Mission \$55,555

The LCMS has been sending missionaries into the field since 1894, and today, trains, sends, and supports career, long-term, and short-term missions around the world. As an expression of gratitude to former missionaries and their families, a celebratory reunion is planned to honor and thank them for their service. This event will provide an opportunity for Synod to reconnect with former missionaries and to express to them the value of their service, while allowing these

church servants to renew friendships, review experiences, and rejoice in God's many blessings. This grant will cover lodging, meals, and a stipend to offset travel costs for former missionaries attending the reunion.

# 32. Every One His Witness – LCMS Witness and Outreach Ministry \$33,500

With over 200 million non-churched people in the United States, this initiative is a witness and outreach evangelism program that equips believers to be effective witnesses of Jesus in their everyday lives. It approaches witnessing and outreach as the calling of every believer, focusing particularly in the United States, to share in God's joy as He works through us to gather the lost into His Church. The LCMS, in its June 2016 Convention, adopted this program for implementation throughout the LCMS.

# 33. Nursing Students Serving with Mercy Medical Team - LCMS Office of International Mission \$25,000

Seeking to expand their educational exposure, nursing students in the Concordia University System would be afforded the opportunity to participate in a short-term mission trip to Madagascar with a Mercy Medical Team. This service opportunity for students to work with medical professionals in providing medical and/or spiritual care to the under-served would be invaluable.

# 34. Engaging RSOs – LCMS Recognized Service Organizations \$27,800

LCMS RSOs will be able to partner more effectively with congregations in providing acts of mercy and will be equipped with the skills and resources to network more efficiently with congregational members, other Lutheran entities, their communities, and the church at large. Grants will provide consulting in such things as fund development and board governance; funds will permit Chief Executive Officers to attend Lutheran professional conferences relating to leadership, board development, and funding; and relationships will be strengthened between congregations and RSOs in providing services and resources to serve those in need.

### 1. Completion of Lukonda Lutheran School Buildings, Uganda – Lutheran Church Uganda \$48,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has charged us to reach out to all nations; and

WHEREAS, Educating Christian youth is a means of propagating His Word to future generations; and WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) Southeastern District and Resurrection Lutheran Church of Cary, North Carolina, have funded Phase I of the construction of two school buildings; and

WHEREAS, The people of the Lutheran Church in Lukonda, Uganda have provided land and bricks for the schools, but are unable to fully finance Phase II of the school construction; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$48,000 to fund completion of the Lukonda Lutheran School Campus.

# 2. Providing Food and the Gospel to Starving Children – Mercy Meals of Siouxland \$40,000

WHEREAS, The Lord commanded the disciples to feed the hungry and make disciples of all nations; and WHEREAS, As many as 14,000 children die each day of starvation in our world, most not knowing Our Lord; and WHEREAS, Mercy Meals feed the body and the Gospel feeds the soul; and

WHEREAS, Donations are not fully funding the ministry of Mercy Meals of Siouxland at this time; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$40,000 to help fund Providing Food and the Gospel to Starving Children.

# 3. Lutheran Children's Books for Families Worldwide – Lutheran Heritage Foundation \$100,000

WHEREAS, People were bringing babies to Jesus for Him to bless them, and Jesus called the children to Him saying, But Jesus called them to him, saying, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God." (Luke 18:16); and

WHEREAS, With the growth of Lutheran churches and missions around the world, new Christian parents want to teach their children about their Lord Jesus Christ but lack Lutheran Bible storybooks in their own languages; and WHEREAS, Lutheran missionaries and church leaders worldwide have expressed a deep need for Lutheran materials, printed in the native languages of the people they serve, so that they may better share the Lutheran faith with families in their care; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Heritage Foundation, an LCMS Recognized Service Organization (RSO), has for 25 years

vigorously fulfilled its mission of translating, publishing, and distributing Lutheran books (including *A Child's Garden of Bible Stories* and *Bible Stories in Pictures*) into more than 90 languages, giving LCMS missionaries, pastors, and families the tools they need to introduce children to Jesus; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Lutheran Children's Books for Families Worldwide.

### 4. Christian Hope Through Mass Media in Egypt – Lutheran Hour Ministries \$100,000

WHEREAS, The mission of Lutheran Hour Ministries, based on the clear teaching of Scripture, is bringing Christ to the nations and the nations to the Church; and

WHEREAS, Lutheran Hour Ministries' center in Egypt will carry out our mission to millions of people in Egypt and the Middle East; and

WHEREAS, Lutheran Hour Ministries has developed Christian Hope Through Mass Media in Egypt to reach and connect with Arabic-speaking families and youth, refugees, and citizens of the region through social media and Arabic satellite television; and

WHEREAS, There is a need to expand Christian Hope Through Mass Media in Egypt in reaching families and youth with the message of faith and trust in God, in reaching refugees in camps where 60 percent are youth, and be a strong Christian witness of love and forgiveness through Egyptian-dialect Arabic television programming; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Christian Hope Through Mass Media in Egypt.

### 5. Laborers of Love - Lutheran Braille Workers \$100,000

WHEREAS, Jesus declares, "The sower soweth the Word" (Mark 4:14 KJ21), and He uses our hands to do the sowing; and WHEREAS, Lutherans Braille Workers (LBW), one of the largest producer of biblical Braille in the world, is daily asked to send God's Word to blind and visually impaired people around the world; and

WHEREAS, LBW has been providing the New International Version translation of the Bible to people with visual impairment free of charge for more than 25 years; and WHEREAS, The LCMS has chosen to use the English Standard Version of the Bible and funds are needed to produce the English Standard Version of the Bible for the blind and visually impaired; therefore be it RESOVLED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Laborers of Love - Lutheran Braille Workers.

# 6. Education Loan Repayment Assistance Grants – MinistryFocus \$100,000

WHEREAS, For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, (Eph. 2:8), So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. (Romans 10:17), and hearing requires proclamation; and

WHEREAS, The proclamation of many called workers of the LCMS are inhibited by a mismatch of burdensome educational debt with low levels of income; and WHEREAS, The potential of long-standing debt may also negatively impact recruitment and retention of called workers; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Education Loan Repayment Assistance Grants.

### 7. Fairmount Coffee House Outreach Ministry – Lutheran Student Center, Wichita, Kansas \$100,000

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Student Center of Wichita, Kansas, established 50 years ago seeks to expand its ministry and introduce more Wichita State University (WSU) students to the Gospel of Jesus Christ; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Student Center of 2017 will be reaching out to the students of WSU and the local Fairmount neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Student Center will open a coffee house outreach ministry inside the center called the Fairmount Coffee House and will engage our guests by utilizing coffee as our well (John 4:1-42) to share the love of Jesus with them; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Fairmount Coffee House Outreach Ministry.

# 8. RECONNECT to the Body of Christ, Circuit 28 – Texas District \$50,000

WHEREAS, Today the United States is the third largest mission field in the world; and

WHEREAS, The Brownsville/Harlingen Texas metro area in the Rio Grande Valley has the distinction of being the lowest socio-economic metro area in the United States with 35% of the people living in poverty; and

WHEREAS, Bold new steps such as the 'RECONNECT to the Body of Christ' initiative are required to reconnect struggling congregations and their communities to the body of Christ: and

WHEREAS, 'RECONNECT to the Body of Christ' is a nontraditional missional model program that will show small struggling congregations how they too can bring professional church workers and relationship building programs into their circuits, training church members in successful methods of reconnecting congregations with their community; therefore be it

RESOVLED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$50,000 to help fund RECONNECT to the Body of Christ.

# 9. The Reformation Continues: Lectionaries in West Africa – Lutheran Bible Translators \$108,800

WHEREAS, The Great Commission of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, commands us to reach out to all at home and abroad; and

WHEREAS, 2017 marks the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation, remembering the clear Gospel message it conveyed to Christian communities throughout the world; and WHEREAS, Lutheran Bible Translators continues this reformation vision by working in minority language communities in some of the most difficult to reach places in the world; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Churches in Cameroon and Ghana West Africa have requested Lutheran Bible Translators to translate and provide the portions of Scripture necessary for the lectionary to be used in their churches; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$108,800 to help fund The Reformation Continues: Lectionaries in West Africa.

### 10. Training Lutheran Middle Eastern Missionaries – Biblical Orthodox Lutheran Mission \$93,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has charged us to reach out to all nations; and

WHEREAS, The teaching and preaching of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus to those bound in chains through ignorance and through cults is crucial; and

WHEREAS, Extraordinary means are necessary to reach those in Muslim countries; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$93,000 to help fund the work of Biblical Orthodox Lutheran Mission in the Middle East and worldwide to bring Muslims and others to the Lord Jesus.

### 11. "Set To Serve" - Voice of Care \$100,000

WHEREAS, There are millions of people throughout the United States with disabilities (developmental, traumainduced or age-onset) and research confirms that 90% of these people are not connected with a congregation; and WHEREAS, Voice of Care has the specific resources and

tools to train congregations in a variety of targeted programs designed to reach this lost population for Jesus; and WHEREAS, Voice of Care understands not all congregations can independently afford this kind of training, and some are remotely located and could not easily or affordably travel to training workshops and seminars but still desire to reach out to people with disabilities and their caregivers within their communities; and

WHEREAS, Voice of Care's present resources do not cover the costs of providing affordable workshops and seminars throughout the United States or the necessary equipment and technology for creating and presenting webinars and videos; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Voice of Care's "Set to Serve" initiative.

### 12. Student Leadership Training Conferences— Lutheran Campus Ministry Association \$30,000

WHEREAS, Jesus Christ has commanded each of us his followers, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19); and

WHEREAS, The students, faculty, and staff on the campuses of the United States post-secondary schools comprise what has been called "America's foremost mission field;" and WHEREAS, Lutheran campus ministries are ideal environments for training LCMS-member students in witnessing, reaching out, and disciple-building in the university context; and

WHEREAS, Regional ministry events such as the Lutheran Campus Mission Association-sponsored Campus Ministry Leadership Conference offer the potential to equip hundreds of student leaders to share Christ and build new disciples; therefore be it

RESOVLED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$30,000 to help fund New Regional Campus Ministry Student-Leadership Training.

## 13. Training Teachers for Today's Learners – Lutheran Special Education Ministries \$100,000

WHEREAS, But Jesus called them to him, saying, "Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Luke 18:16); and

WHEREAS, National statistics indicate that one in five children in the United States has a learning need while educational funding for those children are not provided to faith-based schools; and

WHEREAS, Teachers in Lutheran schools and churches are "the hands and feet of Jesus" within their communities; and WHEREAS, Lutheran Special Education Ministries'

commitment to serving children, their families, schools, churches, and the community has been evident for 140 years; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Training Teachers for Today's Learners.

## 14. Mercy House for Women and Children – Franklin Avenue Mission, Flint, Michigan \$100,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word challenges His followers to humble ourselves and serve the underserved, spiritually, physically, and emotionally; and WHEREAS, Flint, Michigan, one of the poorest cities in America, where 46% of the general population and 66% of the children live below the poverty line, with Flint's east side at 80% below poverty level; and

WHEREAS, Women and children are a part of this vulnerable population; and

WHEREAS, The Franklin Avenue Mission is sustained entirely by member congregations and individual donations and volunteers; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund The Mercy House for Women and Children in Flint, Michigan.

## 15. Sharing Jesus with People with Disabilities – Bethesda Lutheran Communities \$100,000

WHEREAS, God, in His Holy Word, tells us that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made," and He knit us together in our mother's womb, each one of us is the body of Christ and a part of it arranged by God as He wanted us to be, and that Christ Jesus died for ALL people; and

WHEREAS, We, as Lutheran Christians, believe adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities should have the opportunity to connect and fully participate in the life of the congregation of their choice; and

WHEREAS, Ministry consultants are needed to travel to visit the people we support, their families, congregations, and other partners as needed to facilitate faith connections; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Bethesda Lutheran Communities Sharing Jesus with People with Disabilities.

## 16. Restoration Programs for Native Hawaiians – Lutheran Indian Ministries \$75,000

WHEREAS, Isaiah 61:1 says, The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good

news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound, and Native Hawaiian, Clarence, of Lutheran Indian Ministries, is ministering to Native Hawaiians on the island of Oahu; and

WHEREAS, Clarence DeLude III, who has a master's degree in Lutheran education, is enrolled in the Cross-Cultural Ministry Center Program at Concordia University, Irvine, California, leading to ordination in 2019; and WHEREAS, The majority of Native Hawaiians live in poverty which contributes to dysfunctional behaviors in families, substance and sexual abuse, violence and suicide that leave many hurting with little hope; and

WHEREAS, A former church building is available for various Gospel-oriented programs for youth and adults such as: Vacation Bible School, Teen Camp, Bible studies, seminars, training of facilitators, and cultural arts program to draw Native Hawaiians to Christ and His church, thus bringing hope and restoration; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$75,000 to help fund theological training for Clarence and support Gospeloriented programs for Native Hawaiians to know Jesus Christ, the only source of Truth, Restoration, and Hope.

## 17. Family Scholarships for Short Term Mission Trips – MOST Ministries \$60,000

WHEREAS, Christ has charged us in His Holy Word to "make disciples of all nations..."; and

WHEREAS, It can be financially difficult for families to serve as members of a short term mission team since the typical trip costs anywhere from \$2,000 - \$4,000; and

WHEREAS, Nurturing a mission-minded spirit in families through serving as members of a short term mission team will strengthen their faith and provide encouragement to reaching all nations through mission work; and

WHEREAS, MOST Ministries, an RSO of the LCMS, is seeking \$60,000 for scholarships to assist families in serving their Lord on short term mission trips; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$60,000 to help fund Family Scholarships for Short Term Mission Trips.

## 18. Expanding the Broadcast of Worship for Shut-Ins – Lutheran Ministries Media, Inc. \$80,000

WHEREAS, The great commission moves us in Mark 16:15 to "Go into all the world and proclaim the Gospel to the whole creation;" and

WHEREAS, Lutheran Ministries Media shares Christ's love every week through television broadcast ministry of Worship for Shut-Ins; and WHEREAS, Worship for Shut-Ins is uniquely positioned to reach a growing population of those who are aging and unchurched; and

WHEREAS, Worship for Shut-Ins seeks to boldly proclaim God's Word throughout new television markets and the internet; therefore be it

RESOVLED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$80,000 to help fund Expanding the Broadcast of Worship for Shut-Ins.

## 19. Equipping Youth to Witness for Life – Y4Life – Lutherans for Life \$25,000

WHEREAS, The mission of Y4Life, a ministry of Lutherans for Life, is to equip Lutheran youth and young adults to be Gospel-motivated voices for life who set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity (1 Tim. 4:11); and

WHEREAS, 1.2 million women have abortions every year in the United States, with approximately 27% of those having no religious affiliation; and

WHEREAS, There is a great need to equip young Lutherans to share the Gospel through life issues and serve in their own schools and communities; and

WHEREAS, Y4Life seeks to equip young people to speak for life and serve their community through student-led life ministries on high school and college campuses; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$25,000 to help fund Equipping Youth to Witness for Life - Y4Life.

## 20. Forming International Teachers and Leaders – Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri \$100,000

WHEREAS, The global proclamation of Christ's love and the message of eternal salvation through faith in Him continues to be paramount and, blessedly, the sharing of the Gospel message is increasing in many different parts of the world, and Lutheranism is spreading in entire regions of different continents; and

WHEREAS, There is a significant shortage of Lutheran pastors with advanced theological education in the majority of these countries; many more pastors are needed to ensure that the Word of God continues to spread in these nations; options outside the U.S. are few for the advanced theological study that is needed for these pastors, and a few of these Lutheran church bodies have the funds to send their most capable students to the U.S. for this advanced study; and WHEREAS, Concordia Seminary's Graduate School not only stands ready to welcome these international students, but continues to give high priority to their pastoral formation; and WHEREAS, The LCMS has named supporting and

expanding theological education as one of its key mission priorities to ensure that there will be pastors to lead Lutheran congregations throughout the world; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to fund Forming International Teachers and Leaders.

## 21. Tanzanian Sewing Center – Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT) \$25,000

WHEREAS, The Bishop Makala Sewing Center strives to train desperately poor young women in Tanzania who are faced with choosing between starvation and prostitution, who neither work nor attend school, who are untrained in any skill; and

WHEREAS, Becoming mired in human trafficking, many women meet extremely unhealthy situations in the cities where they seek to sustain their lives, the result being unexpected pregnancy, disease, and degradation; and WHEREAS, The Christians in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania are committed to connecting these women to Jesus, providing Christian education, teaching life skills, providing a safe environment for learning, emphasizing Christian unity among them and purchasing products from them as well as developing additional markets for their sewing skills; and

WHEREAS, Though extremely rich in spiritual blessings and a will to serve, these African Christians do not have the means to reach the many suffering, but we have the means to provide Christ's mercy and compassion through our gift; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$25,000 to help fund the Tanzanian Sewing Center.

### 22. Christian Eldercare Home in Haiti – Ministry in Mission \$100,000

WHEREAS, The Great Commission of our Lord Jesus Christ is to make disciples of all nations, He also calls His people to travel in the footsteps of St. Paul to foreign soil; and WHEREAS, God has completed the LCMS Lutheran Village construction project in Haiti for mercy and Gospel outreach to Haitian Lutherans and unchurched citizens; and WHEREAS, Ministry in Mission, an RSO of the LCMS, has continued to work in Haiti for nine years as a conduit to support and encourage The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti; and

WHEREAS, The mission includes construction of homes and churches, promoting and supporting feeding programs for the children and elderly, teaching and serving fellow Christians and evangelizing non-Christians, understanding that help is needed to provide shelter and care for the elderly; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Christian Eldercare Home in Haiti.

## 23. Raising Pastors and Deaconesses – Evangelical Lutheran Church of Liberia \$97,000

WHEREAS, The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Liberia, being a partner church body of the LCMS; and WHEREAS, Its goals and objectives are the development of human resources towards the proclamation and teaching of the Gospel unto repentance and the salvation of souls through Word and Sacrament; and

WHEREAS, The building and establishment of seminary/ university is necessary to train pastors, deaconesses, and other church workers; and

WHEREAS, This seminary project, being a priority need for the church and people of Liberia, will provide adequate opportunity, both spiritual and physical, to over 10,000 men and women in service of the Gospel, especially those who are just recovering from 20 brutal years of civil wars and are now engaged in rebuilding their lives and homes, therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League National Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$97,000 to fund the construction of a seminary/university in Monrovia, Liberia.

### 24. Current Missionary Need – LCMS International Mission \$100,000

WHEREAS, since the LWML at its founding in 1942 identified its purpose "to develop a greater mission consciousness among women and to gather funds for mission projects for which no adequate provision was made in the LCMS budget;" and

WHEREAS, Jesus has called our LCMS missionaries to go into all the world to proclaim Him and they are indeed required to provide all necessary resources to serve; and WHEREAS, Lutheran women attending this convention, empowered by the Holy Spirit, through Word and Sacrament, to proclaim Jesus Christ above all, can assist this endeavor of our missionaries with mite dollars and prayers; and WHEREAS, The blessed gift of money will be awarded with the greatest prayerful discretion by the knowledgeable LCMS Mission Central staff, with the recommendation and endorsement of the LCMS Office of International Mission, and given to the most current and urgent needs of our missionaries waiting to serve or already in the field; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help fund Current Missionary Need.

### 25. Lutheran World Relief Quilt and Kit Shipping Fund \$80,000

WHEREAS, Our Lord Jesus Christ, being above all, cared for the poor and fed the hungry, and that God, our Creator and Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit fill us with the desire to care for the hungry, those who thirst and those with nothing; and WHEREAS, For over 70 years, LWML and Lutheran World Relief have worked together in Christian love to provide for the needs of people worldwide with handmade quilts and kits; and

WHEREAS, These gifts of faith provide Lutherans of all ages a hands-on way to reach out and share the love of Jesus with their furthest neighbors, and in doing so grow in their faith while offering new hope for families worldwide; and WHEREAS, *The Lord watches over the sojourners; he upholds the widow and the fatherless* (Ps.146:9), and we follow by giving them first priority in receiving these gifts as the intensity of humanitarian needs increases around the world; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$80,000 to fund the Lutheran World Relief Quilt and Kit Shipping.

## 26. NOLA 4H: Hearts for the Hungry, Homeless, and Hurting – Christian Families United for Progress \$100,000

WHEREAS, Christ, in His Holy Word, has charged us to reach out to the hungry, homeless, and hurting poor; and WHEREAS, Inner-city churches are a means of providing mercy ministries and propagating His Word to all people, most especially "the least of these;" and

WHEREAS, The people of Christian Families United for Progress (six New Orleans Lutheran churches with African-American pastors serving the inner city) are unable to finance fully the cost of feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, and providing healing to the hurting; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$100,000 to help aid the hurting in New Orleans, Louisiana.

## 27. Libraries and Literacy in China – Concordia Welfare & Education Foundation \$88,890

WHEREAS, The Holy Word speaks in 1 Corinthians 3:6, I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase. So then neither he who plants is anything, nor the one who waters, but God who gives the increase. Now he who plants and he who waters are one, and each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor (NKJV).; and

WHEREAS, Lutheran Christians have established Concordia Welfare & Education Foundation (CWEF), a mercy organization in Asia, that is equipped to serve people living in poverty through education and human care programs; and WHEREAS, Rural China communities comprised of impoverished families and left-behind children do not have access to appropriate reading materials or adequate adult support to develop good reading habits; and

WHEREAS, CWEF has observed God's hand in providing sharing opportunities through providing library and literacy programs in China that will enable students and teachers to have access to age appropriate reading material and literacy activities which will support the development of reading and writing abilities; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$88,890 to help fund CWEF Libraries and Literacy in China.

## 28. Christ for Veterans and Their Families – LCMS Ministry of the Armed Forces \$27,750

WHEREAS, For everything there is a season, a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up (Ecc. 3:1-3); and

WHEREAS, Ministry to the Armed Forces/Operation Barnabas (son of encouragement) seeks to train, equip, and encourage LCMS districts, congregations, and their members, as well as local Operation Barnabas District Chapters and counselors, to share with their congregations techniques for compassionate care and Gospel sharing outreach; and WHEREAS, There has been an immense drawdown of our military forces sending soldiers to return to civilian communities and their families, thousands of whom struggle with physical, mental, financial, and emotional stresses; and WHEREAS, This time of adjustment to a more normal pace of life within our civilian communities is an important period of critical adjustment and we want to equip churches to reach out to veterans and their families with the love of Christ; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$27,750 to help fund Christ for Veterans and Their Families.

### 29. Christ's Care for Children: Kenya – LCMS Office of International Mission \$60,000

WHEREAS, The Great Commission of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, commands us to reach out to all at home and abroad; and

WHEREAS, About 1.4 million children in Kenya and their families are affected by AIDS, and an estimated eight percent of Kenyan adults are living with the HIV virus, resulting in many children dropping out of school because they cannot pay school expenses, and may be forced into child labor or sexual exploitation; and

WHEREAS, Ministry partners aim to guide at-risk children into the homes of loving families and under the wing of Evangelical Lutheran Church of Kenya (ELCK) congregations to help children become educated, responsible Christian adults; and

WHEREAS, Tuition scholarships can provide a Kenyan child with care, including food and both educational and spiritual support so that 25 children can be cared for two years; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$60,000 to help fund Christ's Care for Children: Kenya.

### 30. Prison and Jail Ministry Synod-wide Conference in 2018 \$36,500

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has charged us to reach out to those in prison in Matthew 25:36, *I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.*, and we are told in Hebrews 13:3a *Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them...*; and

WHEREAS, Synod agreed in Convention in July 2013 to have a prison and jail ministry coordinator in each of our 37 districts, either volunteer or compensated, for the purpose of researching opportunities, training, providing guidelines, equipping congregations, and networking for prison and jail ministry; and

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Women's Missionary League funded the first two Synod-wide Prison and Jail Ministry Conferences, which enabled over 200 lay and clergy participants from 30 of our LCMS districts to learn about the importance of prison and jail ministry, network with one another for best practices and support each other; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$36,500 to help fund the Prison and Jail Ministry Conference throughout Synod for 2018.

### 31. Thanking Former Missionaries – LCMS Office of International Mission \$55,555

WHEREAS, By the grace of God, the LCMS has sent missionaries into the world since 1894 in response to our Lord's command to make disciples of all nations; and WHEREAS, The Lord of the harvest has blessed LCMS mission efforts through the faithful service of thousands of rostered church workers and lay men and women throughout the years that have resulted in the formation of Lutheran schools, congregations, medical centers, and independent church bodies that remain faithful to the Gospel; and WHEREAS, The service of these faithful missionaries often resulted in hardship, personal loss, and death – yet they

served with joy, laying the foundation of LCMS mission work across the globe and furthering the Gospel of Jesus Christ; and

WHEREAS, Former LCMS missionaries have expressed interest in reuniting with colleagues engaged in mission service; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$55,555 to fund Thanking Former Missionaries.

## 32. Every One His Witness – LCMS Witness and Outreach Ministry \$33,500

WHEREAS, The Great Commission, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matt. 28:19-20); and WHEREAS, North America now constitutes the world's third largest mission field (after China and India based on the number of people who do not confess Jesus Christ) with over 200 million non-churched people, meaning that, with over 2.3 million baptized members, the LCMS has an amazing opportunity to "go therefore" and reach others with the Gospel; and

WHEREAS, The LCMS, in its June 2016 Convention, adopted Every One His Witness as an evangelism program throughout Synod and commends the use of Every One His Witness evangelism program to all LCMS districts, congregations, RSOs, and auxiliaries; and WHEREAS, Continued module development, utilization of various media formats, and other resources developed in multiple languages as well as regional workshops for the Every One His Witness evangelism program are needed; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$33,500 to help fund Every One His Witness.

## 33. Nursing Students Serving with Mercy Medical Team – LCMS Office of International Mission \$25,000

WHEREAS, Christ in His Holy Word has charged us to reach out to all nations in Matthew 25:40, "And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me"; and

WHEREAS, LCMS teams bring urgently needed medical and/or spiritual care to under-served countries around the world offering medical professionals, pastors, and hardworking laity an opportunity to volunteer abroad in a variety of clinical and health-related settings; and

WHEREAS, The experiences for students of any discipline, but particularly nursing students, to work directly with experienced professionals while providing mercy to people are

not only valuable, but immeasurable; and WHEREAS, Financial considerations often prevent nursing students from participating in Mercy Medical Teams and a grant would aid in the expenses for Concordia University System nursing students to participate in a mission trip with the Mercy Medical Team to Madagascar; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$25,000 to help fund Nursing Students Serving with Mercy Medical Team.

## 34. Engaging RSOs – LCMS Recognized Service Organizations \$27,800

WHEREAS, "The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these" (Mark 12:31); and

WHEREAS, The granting of RSO status by the Synod signifies that a service organization, "while independent of the Synod, fosters the mission and ministry of the church, engages in program activity that is in harmony with the programs of the boards of the Synod, and respects and does not act contrary to the doctrine and practice of the Synod"; and

WHEREAS, The LCMS desires and encourages its RSOs to live out their Lutheran identity in the services and programs they provide; and

WHEREAS, Congregations and members will partner together with a RSO and provide a service or acts of mercy to the community, providing congregational members with opportunities to live out our calling to love and serve our neighbor; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the delegates gathered at the 2017 Lutheran Women's Missionary League Convention in Albuquerque, New Mexico, vote the sum of \$27,800 to help fund Engaging RSOs.



At the 1999 LWML Minneapolis Convention, the term "mission projects" was changed to "mission grants" to reflect the fact that LWML supplies funds to groups who do the actual work on projects.

## Mission Grants - THE Story!

### Eighty mission grant proposals were received in 2017!

Here's the process used to select those that actually appear on the 2017 convention ballot:

- \* LWML women from many districts, as well as personnel from The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS,) gathered facts about groups for which they saw a need for funding. They acquired necessary approvals and signatures (as stated in the Mission Grant Proposal Guidelines) and submitted the proposals electronically to the LWML Vice President of Gospel Outreach by the September 30, 2016 deadline.
- \* The Vice President reviewed each submission to ascertain that all of the components were present and prepared a packet of information for each proposal. Copies were then sent to the nine members of the LWML Mission Grant Selection Committee: the LWML President, the Vice President of Gospel Outreach, the two Pastoral Counselors, and Mission Grants Committee members. Copies were also made available to designated LCMS personnel.
- \* Prior to the Mission Grants Selection Committee meeting, members prayerfully read and evaluated each proposal. Questions were submitted to Synod personnel who attended a portion of the meeting. Again, covering their decisions with prayers for guidance, the Committee sorted the grants into categories and made their selections. Votes needed to be unanimous to move each grant forward.
- \* Proposals selected for the ballot were presented to the LWML Board of Directors for their vote, the results of which appear on the convention ballot. Convention delegates will make the final selection of grants to be funded by LWML mite offerings.
- \* Some proposals not chosen for the convention ballot were added to a Grants Bank and will be made available to LWML districts for their 2018 conventions; others were suggested for convention offerings.

Selecting grants to be funded by LWML mite offerings has been the hallmark of the organization for all 75 years of its existence. During that time, nearly 400 groups in 71 countries around the world have received resources to share God's love and witness to His saving grace. We give God all the glory and thank Him for allowing us to participate in spreading the Gospel.

Many recipients of LWML grants have expressed their gratitude to God for the blessings they received. Destitute post-war Europeans in 1945 received food, medicine, bedding, clothing, and Christian books from the LWML's second grant. One recipient wrote a poignant letter: "For seven years we did not have enough to eat ... we felt your package was a gift from the Lord ... It was my mother's birthday and we were able to give her the warm coat that you sent. Thanks for it all." (Taege, Marlys. *Women IN God's Service*. Lutheran Women's Missionary League, 1991.)

## Your Mite Offerings Have Made an Impact!



LWML's very first mission grant recipient was Christ Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Cleveland, Ohio. Mite offerings supplied funding to build their church, which was dedicated in 1949. The congregation is still active today.







## **Board of Directors Structure Task Force**

The Task Force was appointed to study and recommend the restructure of the Board of Directors (BOD) to be more effective in participation and decision-making and better stewards of time and money. Appointment of this Task Force was recommended by the 2013 LWML Business Practices Review Task Force and approved by the BOD in February 2015. Review of current structure and function as directed in the Bylaws was followed by a review of current actual activities and responsibilities of the BOD. A survey of present and past BOD members provided perspective on the lived experience and preferences of BOD members. In-depth study of best practices for governance by non-profit boards of directors provided insight for improvements that would increase effectiveness and efficiency for LWML.

The Task Force met six times during the biennium to complete the assigned work. In June 2016, the

recommendation for restructure of the BOD was delivered to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee handed the two-phase recommendation to the Board of Directors in Fall 2016 and the Structure Committee drafted a bylaw change to implement the first phase. The BOD approval in January 2017 brings the bylaw amendment to the voting assembly in convention in Albuquerque.

The work of this Task Force is complete. It has been our pleasure to serve LWML. To God be the Glory!

## **Special Committee Reports**

#### PLANNED GIVING COUNCIL (PGC)

As LWML celebrates its 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary, we also praise God for His incredible faithfulness for the LWML Gifts of Love (GOL) Ministry which started 10 years ago with a \$100,000 grant from Thrivent. Shortly thereafter the Executive Committee (EC) appointed a committee to be the liaison between our Planned Giving Counselor, Pat Bilow, and the EC. The Council was tasked with overseeing some of the budgeting aspects of the grant, connecting with the LCMS Foundation for a contractual agreement for Pat, and supporting the new GOL Ministry. Since then, both the Gifts of Love Ministry and the Gift Planning Council has expanded. The Ministry team now includes Linda Gage as our full-time Planned Giving Counselor, while Pat continues to serve faithfully on a part-time basis. Both are supported by staff and an amazing group of volunteers in 11 districts called Gift Planning Supporters or Gift Planning Advocates, depending on their role.

The Gift Planning Council is appointed by the LWML President. It reviews the Gifts of Love Ministry budget and quarterly financial reports, takes action on recommendations, job description changes, and policies, helps provide annual training for new and existing Advocates and Supporters, provides attendance of a council member and counselors to the annual ALDE Conference, supports the Gifts of Love Legacy Circle, keeps the Gifts of Love Ministry team in their prayers, and the pastoral counselor provides Stewardship Notes for the weekly GOL eNewsletter. The council meets via WebEx and reports through its chairman to the Executive Committee and is represented at Board of Directors by the chairman and the Gift Planning Counselor.

Did you know that our Gifts of Love ministry is not funded through the LWML operating budget? After the initial grant, we have relied on a small group of donors to support this unique ministry which not only helps people plan their estate but also gives them opportunities to put their faith into action by making bequests to LWML and LCMS ministries. We are beginning to see the benefits of the Gifts of Love Ministry **on both the national and district levels** and believe it will continue to significantly bless the LWML with future estate gifts.

In order to expand our donor base — and keep this vital service free to those who use it — in 2016 we embarked on a Gifts of Love Matching Gift Fund Challenge with a \$25,000 matching grant provided by LWML Past President Gloria Edwards. Spearheaded by 100% support of the LWML Past Presidents, the Gifts of Love Ministry Team, and the Executive Committee, it was introduced to the BOD in February 2016, asking them to also support the ministry in any amount. We received such a great response that our initial goal of matching \$25,000 was met. Thanks be to God! Then, Cheryl Keithly, one of the Gift Planning Advocates also gifted \$25,000 for the challenge — and by the end of December 2016, close to \$85,000 was received.

Thank you for sustaining this LWML ministry! Thank you for recognizing the great love of our Savior, the provision of our God, and responding to it. Thank you to those who continue to further God's kingdom with their estate plans! #### DIRECTOR OF FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION - Kelley Young

The headquarters for the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is located in the Concordia Publishing House building in Saint Louis, Missouri. The purpose of the LWML professional office staff is to perform the necessary duties required to operate a multi-million dollar non-profit organization. Our staff are wholeheartedly devoted to fulfilling the mission of our organization each day. The staff consists of four full-time and one part-time employee.

#### Primary responsibilities of our staff include:

- Providing assistance to the various committees, districts, zones, and societies;
- Overseeing and managing convention registration;
- Maintaining mailing lists and donor database information;
- Implementing LWML's brand strategies;
- Developing and implementing a strategic marketing and communications plan;
- Upholding accounting processes and procedures in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles;
- Overseeing cash and investment requirements;
- Communicating with the Board of Directors regarding financial matters;
- Preparing and presenting financial statements and related schedules;
- Developing and implementing a digital platform that includes content for website and social media that engages audience segments and leads to measurable action;
- Managing the development, distribution, and maintenance of all print and electronic collateral;
- Collaborating with constituents to achieve desired goals established in the strategic marketing and communication plan;
- Managing all media contacts in cooperation with the LWML President and Public Relations Director;
- Preparing operating, convention, store, and capital budgets;

- Handling accounts payable processing and payments, along with accounts receivable invoicing and receipts;
- Updating the website;
- Receiving, processing, recording, and acknowledging donations;
- Overseeing LWML store inventory balances;
- Determining product pricing for the LWML store;
- Maintaining historical records;
- Addressing phone and website inquiries;
- Attending WebEx meetings for Executive, Finance, Investment, CPC, Strategic Planning, Development/ Advancement, and IT Committees.

## Major achievements of our staff in the 2013-2015 biennium include:

- Implementation of store product guidelines for selection, stock thresholds, and pricing with a focus towards maintaining a specified level of profitability for each product offered and implemented a product barcoding process;
- Continued refinement of roles and responsibilities and identification of staffing needs in order to sustain the level of growth needed to further the LWML mission. A Marketing and Communications Manager was hired in September 2016;


The Mite Box collections began in 1928, and by 1930, 92 Ladies Aid Societies had collected \$6,651.31, mostly from leftover change. In 1942 the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod formally recognized the Lutheran Women's Missionary League as its official women's organization. Over the decades, LWML has distributed more than \$100 million in mission grants to thousands of worthy efforts and causes to help spread the Gospel message and address human care needs both domestically and around the world—all through mites!

By 2006, LWML leadership under past-President Virginia Von Seggern started thinking that even more mission grants could be funded if LWML had its own planned giving ministry. Its purpose would be to encourage faithful stewards to return a portion of their estates to God in thanksgiving for His lifetime provisions of material blessings. The Gifts of Love planned giving ministry was launched in 2007 under the leadership of then-President Linda Reiser. Patricia Bilow, Gift Planning Counselor with the LCMS Foundation, was selected to lay the groundwork.

Five years later, \$25 million in immediate and deferred gifts had been documented from 100+ donors who made planned gifts for LWML and other ministries of the Church. Since then, volunteer Gift Planning Advocates have been added to the ministry to help spread the gift planning word in their home districts. Linda Gage, also a Gift Planning Counselor with the LCMS Foundation, is taking the ministry to even greater levels when in 2013 she replaced Pat who moved to part-time work. By year end 2016, the total to LWML and other church ministries stood at over \$85 million.

By the grace of God, this ministry has flourished through your generosity and heart for ongoing mission outreach. If you have remembered LWML in your gift/estate plan, we give thanks to God for you and invite you to make us aware of your gift so that we can welcome you into the LWML Gifts of Love Legacy Circle. 
