

What is in a name? Shakespeare lamented that when his Romeo spied Juliet and deduces "that which we call a rose/ By any other name would smell so sweet." The theme for this convention is "Jesus Christ (name) above all" is from Philippians 2:9. The emphasis is that Jesus' "name is above every other name."

As you travel around the city of Albuquerque and attend the convention, be bold because you also have the name of Jesus. In verse 13 read how the authorities responded to Peter's and John's actions. Come ready to receive the Word and be astonished at the things done in the name of Jesus.

It is a time to learn and celebrate! (Maybe even pop a cork!) "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens." (Psalm 8:1)
