Dr. Wilfred L. Karsten. Accompanying the 257-member choir for "A New Song," Christine Wallace played the viola.









# HEART TO HEART SISTERS COMMISSIONED



Since its beginning 16 years ago, more than 200 women have gone through the Heart to Heart Sister program. Many of those have also gone onto become Heart to Heart Sister district leaders. This year the South Dakota District will welcome their first Heart to Heart Sister!

The Heart to Heart Sister program allows women an opportunity to know they belong. Languages and backgrounds often isolate, yet we are one in Christ. While attending a national LWML convention, many of the Heart to Heart Sisters see mission grants and their impact.

No matter the country — China, Columbia, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Eritrea, Ethiopia, India, Kenya, Laos, Liberia, Mexico, or Thailand — the smiles and joy of being Heart to Heart Sisters was evident. The 2017 Heart to Heart Sisters each received their pin and a rebozo, a long scarf woven in Mexico, during their commissioning. The translator for one of the sisters also received a pin and rebozo.

Melissa Salomón talked about the wall of crepe paper flowers at their booth in the exhibit hall. "It shows God's diversity and how beautiful it is when put together. Each is unique. It's a picture of Heart to Heart sisters."

Look for your Heart to Heart Sisters identified by their beautiful purple rebozos. They will also be introduced to the convention Saturday afternoon.
