The 38th Biennial Convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League was held at the Mobile Convention Center, Mobile, Alabama, on June 20-23, 2019. The theme for the convention was "In Praise to the LORD!" based on 1 Chronicles 16:23-24: *Sing to the Lord, all the earth! Tell of His salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations.* The convention was broadcast over the internet via livestream for those unable to attend.

LCMS PRESIDENT

Structure Committee Chairman Arlene Naasz, presented the proposed amendment (Addendum 1) to the LWML Bylaws and *MOVED*, by direction of the Board of Directors, their adoption. Article X, Board of Directors, and Article XI, Executive Committee, Amendment 7 were *ADOPTED* by a vote of 510 to 9.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

Treasurer Marilyn Schroeder reported the 2017-2019 mission goal of \$2,075,000 was surpassed by the close of the biennium. She also reported that all 2017-2019 LWML Mission Grants have been paid.

FINANCIAL REPORT

LWML Business Manager Vanessa Johnson presented and reviewed the final financial report (Addendum 2) for the 2017-2019 biennium that was audited by Anders CPAs + Advisors of St. Louis, Missouri. Business Manager Johnson reported that the audit was deemed a clean audit, however there was a misstatement that occurred in the previous biennium that was due to error and not due to fraudulent activities. Gifts that were previously considered revocable were determined to be irrevocable and there was beneficial interest and assets held by others which were not recorded, these amounts were restated and adjustments have been made to the financial statements that were presented. The effect of the adjustments was an increase of \$4,100,000.

Manning is the pastor of Broadmoor Community Lutheran Church in New Orleans. Rev. Manning brought greetings from the church where no perfect people are allowed and how do they know that? Because they have a banner 20 feet by 30 feet outside of his church that tells him that every day when he walks in, and they are so happy to be missionaries along with the LWML. The LWML has allowed them by gifting them with a grant, as a grant recipient, to be the church. He stated, "That is what we're doing, we're being the church! No more no less, we're doing what God has called us to do!"
