

CELEBRATE! YOU ARE A PROMISE

His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires. 2 Peter 1:3-4

Objectives of this study:

That I will CELEBRATE God's promise of love and forgiveness:

- * to me and all people through the redemptive work of Jesus Christ;
- * to me as I face the world, and as I study and share God's Word with all people;
- * as I look forward in hope to eternal life with Him and all believers in Christ.

PROMISE - Poor

- 1. Read Psalm 34:6. (See also Psalm 40:17.) Before God, how am I poor physically? spiritually? Who gives me everything I need and have?
- 2. Read Matthew 5:3. Note: The Greek verb for "poor" in this passage signifies *cringing or crouching like a beggar.* [Lenski] (See notes on Matthew 5:3, <u>R.C.H.</u> <u>Lenski</u>, Wartburg Press, Page 184.) Read Romans 3:10-12. What does it mean to be "poor in spirit"? Am I?
- 3. Read the parable in Luke 18:9-14. When am I like the Pharisee? The tax collector?
- 4. What does God promise in Genesis 3:15? (See also Isaiah 53:5.)

Confess together:

O almighty God, merciful Father, I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess to you all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended you and justly deserved your punishment now and forever. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray you of your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor sinful being.
