TRAINING K-9 COMFORT DOGS

FOR LCMS CHAPLAINS \$30,000

K-9 Comfort Dogs is one of the ministries of Lutheran Church Charities. The charity alerts the faithful when a person, or a church, or a community is suffering and in need. Lutheran Church Charities responded to the Katrina disaster in 2005 making contact in the devastated areas through the use of service dogs. There they saw how utilizing dogs to comfort those who experience disaster had great effect on those in the area. Shootings on the campus of Northern Illinois University in February of 2008 prompted the Lutheran Church Charities to extend an invitation for Pastor Buckhorn and his service dogs to provide comfort to the university students. Since that time, the ministry and demand for the dogs has grown very quickly. K-9 Comfort Dogs, as of the fall of 2012, have been placed in churches, schools, and institutions in six states with more waiting for K-9 Comfort Dogs to finish training. Lutheran Church Charities is able to train each dog for \$10,000. Once the dogs are trained, the LCMS chaplains, or organizations they serve, are responsible for the continued maintenance and financial support for the dogs.

The ministry is nationally utilizing the unique skills of dogs, specifically Golden Retrievers, to open opportunities to touch people with mercy and compassion. They are trained to interact with people in ways that provide a bridge for compassionate ministry to take place. Some of the benefits of the K-9 Comfort Dogs include:

- Calming a hyperactive child or stimulate a withdrawn patient;
- Bring comfort to individuals and families suffering pain and loss;
- Create bridges for compassionate care when disaster strikes; and
- Facilitate conversation and interaction.

The dogs are trained with a protocol similar to that used for service dogs, except these dogs' only job is to listen to people in time of need. Some of the other places the K-9 Comfort Dogs have been used are: the shoreline of New Jersey and New York that was devastated by Hurricane Sandy, the tragedy at Sandy Hook Elementary School (Newtown, Connecticut), and the Boston area after the Boston Marathon bombing.
