REBUILDING NORD EST HAITI LUTHERAN SCHOOL \$100,000

What started as a friendship between two seminary students has developed into the Nord Est Haiti Lutheran School rebuilding. Rev. Daniel Paul from Haiti and Rev. Sam Wiseman from America met at the seminary in Ft. Wayne, Indiana. When Rev. Paul went back to Haiti and started a school and an orphanage, the members of Lamb of God in Lake Stevens, Washington, where Rev. Wiseman served, helped to build the school through short term mission teams. Later when Rev. Wiseman accepted a call to Faith Lutheran Church in La Grande, Oregon, they too helped with mission teams. In 2008 the two churches established an organization to provide long-term support for Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission. During the 2011-2012 school year in Ouanaminthe, Haiti the enrollment at Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission Lutheran Primary School was over 180 students, so the time had come to have a larger facility. The school has three levels of kindergarten through sixth grade. Classes are scattered in the church building, the office building, and the orphanage. The children are taught in French and they study math, science, social studies, French grammar, Creole, history, and geography. The children wear uniforms, memorize Bible verses, are required to attend church each Sunday morning, and are provided hot meals through Trinity/Hope Feeding Program. The uniforms they wear are usually the best clothing they have and for some the hot meal they receive at school is the only meal they receive each day.
