JESUS OUR SAVIOR LUTHERAN SCHOOLS - WINNEBAGO TRIBE, NEBRASKA \$58,553

In August 2004, Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Schools was started because the Winnebago Tribal Council wanted to expand its Christian outreach within its community because they believed that the Tribe's youth needed assistance to meet the demands of the future. The vision for this ministry is to establish a Christ-centered Native-led ministry that offers Word and Sacrament ministry and is supported by the community. For that reason, Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Schools, Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska, has requested a grant of \$58,553 for two part-time staff and additional curriculum to enhance the learning of the Ho-Chunk children in the Winnebago community. Nestled in the Hills of Thurston County, Nebraska, 774 residents reside in the small, rural village of Winnebago 90 miles north of Omaha. In this community is Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Schools that serves 16 preschoolers and 12 students in grades K-3 with wait-lists in both areas. The vision for the Winnebago tribe is to offer a Christ-centered Native-led education to support and motivate their youth. Because of the need for providing high-quality educational excellence, the mission grant for Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Schools, Winnebago Tribe of Nebraska, requests \$58,553 for two part-time additional staff and curriculum needed to meet the ongoing needs of this school.
