Mission Grant Bulletin Bytes

NATIVE AMERICAN OUTREACH TRAINING CENTER - FAIRBANKS,
ALASKA \$95,000

The Native American Outreach Training Center in Fairbanks, Alaska, run by Rev. Dave and Rosemary Sternbeck, provides a place where cross-cultural training, lodging, and food for volunteers takes place. They also envision bringing in Native men during the winter months for a time of encouragement, renewal, and equipping so these men may return to their villages with a message of hope to their people. For that reason, Native American Outreach Training Center has requested a grant of \$95,000 to add bedroom furnishings, a conference table, chairs, large television, whiteboards, a second refrigerator-freezer, washer and dryer, and a vehicle to transport volunteers. These furnishings and vehicle would help to seek to identify, recruit, equip, and empower Native men and women to become spiritual leaders among their own people. Alaskan Natives can come to the North American Outreach Training Center in Fairbanks to receive lodging, food, cross-cultural training, encouragement, and equipping, so they can return to their communities with a message of hope and encourage them to proclaim Christ's Kingdom to their own and to others. Because of the need to connect and equip these people with the spiritual tools needed to take back to their communities, additional home furnishings and transportation are needed to support this ministry with a mission grant request of \$95,000.
