

Female Missionary to Muslim Maninka in Guinea \$100,000

"Though devils all the world should fill, all eager to devour us..." Yes, still today the world is full of the evil ones wanting to devour us. None is more evident than with the unevangelized people of Maninka who worship the Muslim god. Even more daunting is the plight of these Muslim women who are oppressed and unable to speak to any man except their husbands or close relatives.

Sending a female missionary for the Maninka women would be a first for the LCMS. She would need to learn and understand the Maninka people in order to proclaim the forgiveness and refuge of Jesus to them through oral presentations of the Bible and proclaiming the Gospel in a manner appropriate for Muslim women.

A grant of \$100,000 helps support and develop the work of a female missionary to the Muslim Maninka women.

Building Ten Churches in India \$100,000

There is a need in India for church buildings, places for the people to come and receive the gifts of Jesus for their salvation. A permanent building is a statement to the community that the church is here to stay and minister to them.

In India, as in America, it is important to have sacred space in the village
— a place other than a home that is



open to all castes of society to come into the refuge of Jesus.

A grant of \$100,000 makes possible the building of 10 new church facilities in India, establishing worship facilities to proclaim the refuge and righteousness of Jesus to all castes in India.



Circuit Rider for Rural Northwest South Dakota \$65,000

Many ranch families are isolated, and driving long distances to worship is not always easy.

The ministry of South Dakota has its roots with circuit riders who would cover large areas to bring the Word of God and opportunities for worship to homes. Today this approach could service those ranches in the desolate Northwest quarter of South Dakota.

A grant of \$65,000 supports and establishes a circuit rider for rural South Dakota.
