“Fear Not” Inspiration

Shortly after our third child, Kelly, died of SIDS at seven-and-a-half months old, someone brought me a worship bulletin from Luther North High School in Chicago, where I had gone to school. They wanted me to see that the school had sung a song of mine in chapel, one that I had written for National Lutheran Schools Week.

The front of the bulletin featured a student's artwork: a hand-drawn picture of Jesus on the cross, with His arms extended out wide. Underneath the picture were the words: “He loved you this much He spread out His arms and died.”

A melody immediately flooded through my head, along with the first verse. I sat down at the piano, played it, and then wrote the rest of it.

The song has been very comforting on many occasions — a reminder of just how much God loves us. I sang it in church shortly after Kelly died, and my brother-in-law sang it at my mom's funeral.

Jesus ALWAYS has had to remind this little lamb of His that He is with me and, because of that, I need not fear. I'm sure I'm not the only one with the “fear factor” or God wouldn't have repeatedly said “fear not” in the Bible!

I am thankful how the Holy Spirit gave me a song that was therapy to my aching heart, and how He used it to touch others with His powerful and soothing words. His love prevails! He is with us always! Fear not!
