

Travel From Hotels to Convention Center (All LWML contracted hotels are located within five blocks of the convention center.)

District Charter Bus

Charter buses will have a special location for loading and unloading. Check with your bus chairman to be sure your district is providing this daily service.

Automobile Travel

Check the daily parking fees at hotel which can range from \$14–\$27 per day. Parking rates at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center vary from \$8–\$12 per day. Some of the outlying parking lots cost less. Maps and directions will be available at each hotel.

Air Travel

Hotel Shuttles have been arranged for those housed at LWML contracted hotels, using a local bus company. There is no extra fee involved. These Hotel Shuttles will operate during the time before convention activities begin and at the close of each day for three days, Friday through Sunday. They will not run continuously on these days. The exception is Thursday when buses will operate throughout the day and evening. Wednesday they will operate from 4:30–8:30 p.m. Your convention registration badge will be your credentials to ride the Hotel Shuttle buses.
