Devotion

I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me (John 14:6).

We feel overwhelmed with things in our life that are beyond our control.

That's when our only hope is to step back, take a deep breath, and let God be God for a better direction for our life. The Bible, God's Word, has not changed. *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever* (Hebrews 13:8).

We can depend on Jesus to show us the way to our earthly destination. He does this through our Baptism, Holy Communion, and His Word; He also makes sure that we make it to our heavenly home. He did this by dying on the cross in our place. He gave His life so that we might have eternal life. Our life may not seem easy or scenic or the most direct, but when we think we are lost, we have His assurance that He is with us "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20b).
