Twelve women from the community who do not regularly attend services at the mission attended as guests. Pastor Tim led a Bible study before providing babysitting services. Women were able to get to know each other as sisters in Christ and share Navajo tacos.

What an honor!" This group organizes an annual retreat for the Nebraska District pastors' wives. This year's retreat was held at Peace Lutheran, Grand Island. Other members of the care team include Valorie Snow, Deb Burma, Kristin Hopkins, and Pam Williams. The Nebraska pastors' wives group is called DOTS (Daughters of the Savior, Depending on the Savior). This year's theme for the retreat was "Creating a Culture of Grace."

Each woman was gifted a Grace Charm necklace, with 18 printed grace verses, chocolates, a grace-themed pack of nuggets, and a *Starring Roles* devotional booklet. Each participant was able to create four grace-themed coasters.

Masks for Marquette

Lutheran Women in Mission across the nation have been joyfully serving the Lord by serving others during the COVID-19 pandemic, even while social distancing. LWML Vice President of Special Focus Ministries Deaconess Betty Knapp (LWML North Wisconsin District) shares what's being done in her hometown, Marquette, Michigan. "A project called 'Masks for Marquette' was started through a Facebook post in March 2020. The original goal was to ask local seamstresses to sew 5,000 cloth masks that could be used by hospital workers and other essential workers in our county.

"This wasn't a church sponsored project, but there were a lot of women from both my congregation (Redeemer Lutheran) and other churches in town that took up the cause to supply our front-line workers with these masks. In less than

three weeks, the project exploded, and 5,677 masks were completed. It's great to feel like I could contribute to the wellbeing of my community simply by sewing."

LWML Glossary and Abbreviations

To newcomers, the many abbreviations in LWML may make it seem like a secret club. Far from it: it's just easier to abbreviate the long titles and names for various aspects of our organization. Share this list with someone new so she can learn more about how LWML operates.

LWML — Lutheran Women's Missionary League Also commonly known as Lutheran Women in Mission.

BOD — Board of Directors*

The BOD is composed of the elected officers, with the pastoral counselors and the appointed officers as advisory members. The BOD transacts day-today LWML business between LWML conventions.

PA - Presidents Assembly*

The Presidents Assembly is composed of the LWML President and district presidents (DPs). District presidents spend time in spiritual growth, networking, and leadership training. The PA makes decisions that call for financial contributions from the districts.

AOL — Assembly of Leaders

An LWML workshop for LWML leaders.

H2H — Heart to Heart Sisters

A group of women and their mentors who have completed the LWML H2H Sisters training program.

ID — Interdepartmental Meeting

The planning and working session of LWML committees and other personnel; usually held at least once a biennium.

LWQ — Lutheran Woman's Quarterly

The official publication of the LWML.

YWR — Young Woman Representative

A young woman chosen by districts to attend an LWML convention as a non-voting guest.

The ingathering benefitted Daniel's Lion Heart Foundation (more information page 7). The group collected 90 Arch books for children, 22 Scripture coffee mugs, 70 gift cards, and \$793 (toward the purchase of prayer journals) which will be packed into care packages and distributed to families. District President Debbie Curry shares, "Thank you to everyone who brought items. Daniel's Lion Heart Foundation was overwhelmed with the love and support."
