



## A PRIVATE LINE

We all use our phones for a lot of reasons. We use them to visit with family and friends, to call for information or help, to share some exciting news, to inquire about something or someone, to pass the day a little more quickly when we are alone, to order something we need, to set up appointments, or to hear some words of encouragement from someone special when we are having a “bad” day.

In using our phone, we also run into some problems - a wrong number, a busy signal, an answering machine that we don’t want to talk to, a phone that just doesn’t work for some reason, someone else on our phone, or being put on hold by someone. Each of these causes us to get a little upset, or even quite upset, depending on the need for the call we want to make.

Wouldn’t it be nice if we had a private phone line that would work perfectly every time? A phone that we could take everywhere and use anywhere, a phone with no more wrong numbers, no more busy signals, no more answering machines, no more having no one answer the phone, no more being put on hold, no more high phone bills, no more static on the line, and no more being transferred back and forth.

Each of us has our own private line to the Greatest Listener of all times. This private phone line can go anywhere and work everywhere. We will NEVER get a busy signal; NEVER the wrong number; NEVER an answering machine; NEVER a transfer; NEVER any static. We will ALWAYS get the right number; ALWAYS get an answer; and ALWAYS find someone with time to listen. By now, I’m sure that you have figured out that this amazing phone line is PRAYER. PRAYER is simply talking to God.

Most of us began praying before we could talk; we’d follow the example of our parents or grandparents and fold our hands and bow our heads as they said their prayers. As we got older, we learned our own special prayers; some of which we still say today, I’m sure.
