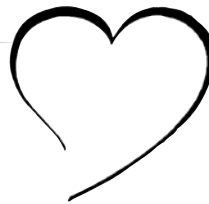

Overflow seating planned for service

Everyone is welcome to attend the Thursday evening worship service beginning with pre-service music at 6:45 p.m. Convention registration is NOT required.

Overflow seating is planned for 800 with a large screen, sound and communion stations.

Doors of the arena will be opened at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday evening for women and men who have nametags as registered guests of the convention. At 6:30 p.m. the arena will be

open to all guests coming for the Worship Service.

There CANNOT be saving of seats. If you plan to sit together, come together. Please help by moving to the center of the rows, filling in every seat and letting ushers know where space is still available.

If you plan to be with guests who are not registered for convention, but just attending the Opening Worship Service, it is suggested you go directly to the overflow area.

Camp

Record numbers of campers have signed up to participate in Camp ROCK activities! At the Convention Center, all campers will enjoy age-appropriate Bible studies or stories, crafts, games, snacks and special entertainment, supervised by caring volunteers. Camp ROCK is open by pre-registration only on Friday and Saturday in Convention Center Rooms 13 and 14.

Nursery- and toddler-aged campers will remain on site in the care of experienced caregiv-

ers. Bible stories, videos, songs, snacks, games, playtime and naps are planned.

Primary-aged children will visit the Washington Pavilion and Terrace Park Aquatic Center on Friday. On Saturday they will experience the Butterfly House and Great Plains Zoo. The oldest group of campers visits the zoo and Outdoor Campus on Friday and the Aquatic Center and Washington Pavilion on Saturday. Transportation, admission, lunch and chaperones are included.

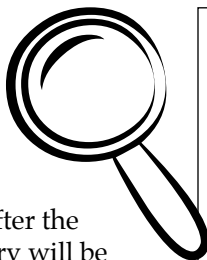
When you have all nine spaces filled in, take your passport to the exhibit hall hostess table near the doors. A hostess will give you a paper for your name and district and then drop it in the box for the

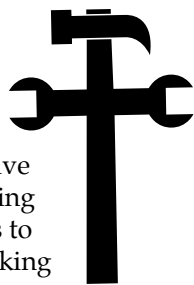
King's Servants ROCK!

Record numbers will participate in King's Servant Activities. Participants will build garden sheds for Habitat for Humanity/Thrivent Builds and sort and pack clothing for Orphan Grain Train. Both of these activities take place in two tents in the north entrance parking lot.

Marking Bibles for prison ministry, making cough pillows for post-operative heart patients, finishing quilts, writing letters to missionaries and making baptismal banners for Native American Missions across the U.S. all happen in Ballroom A of the Convention Center.

Some volunteers will roll up their sleeves and donate blood for the Community Blood Bank of Sioux Falls in two mobile units in front of the Convention Center.

You will want to tour the Habitat for Humanity/Thrivent Builds mobile unit in the north entrance parking lot throughout the day on Thursday.

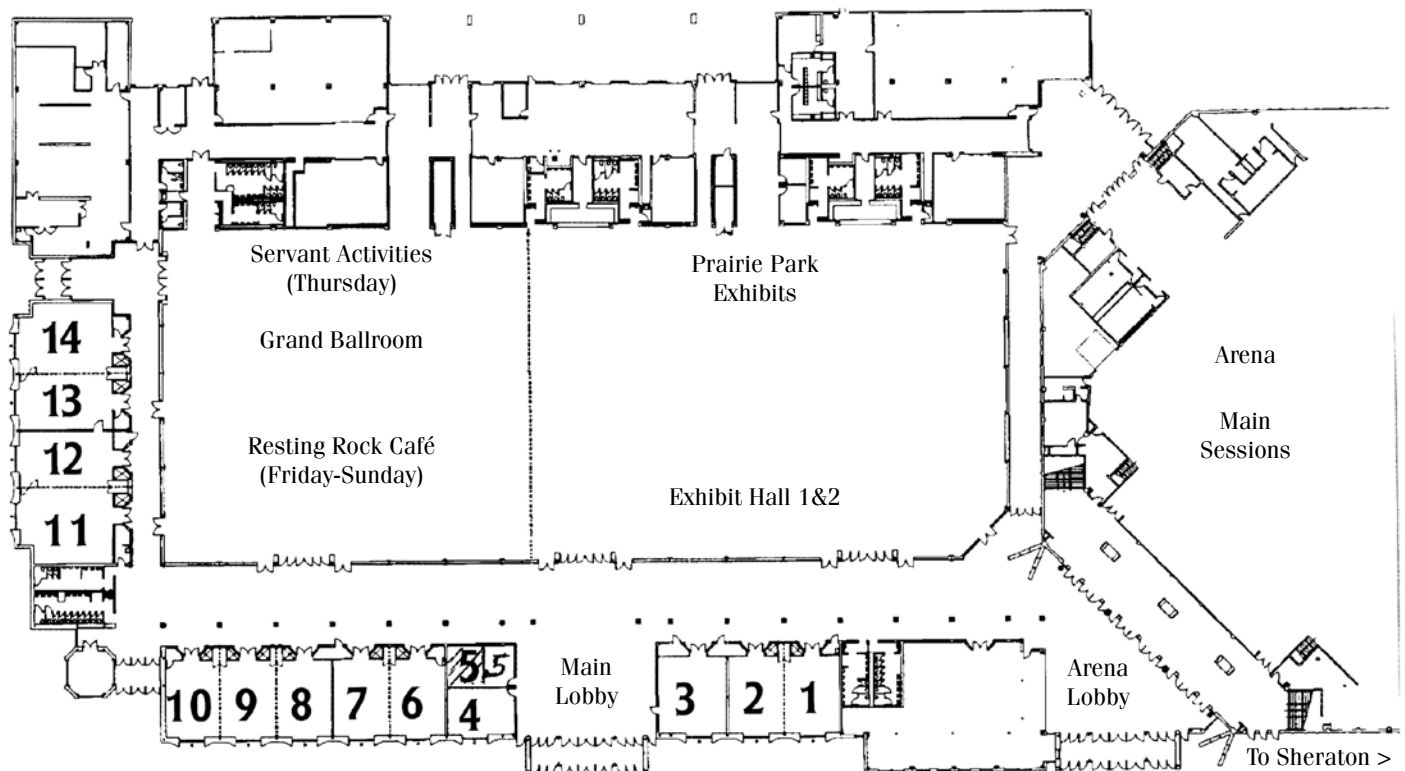
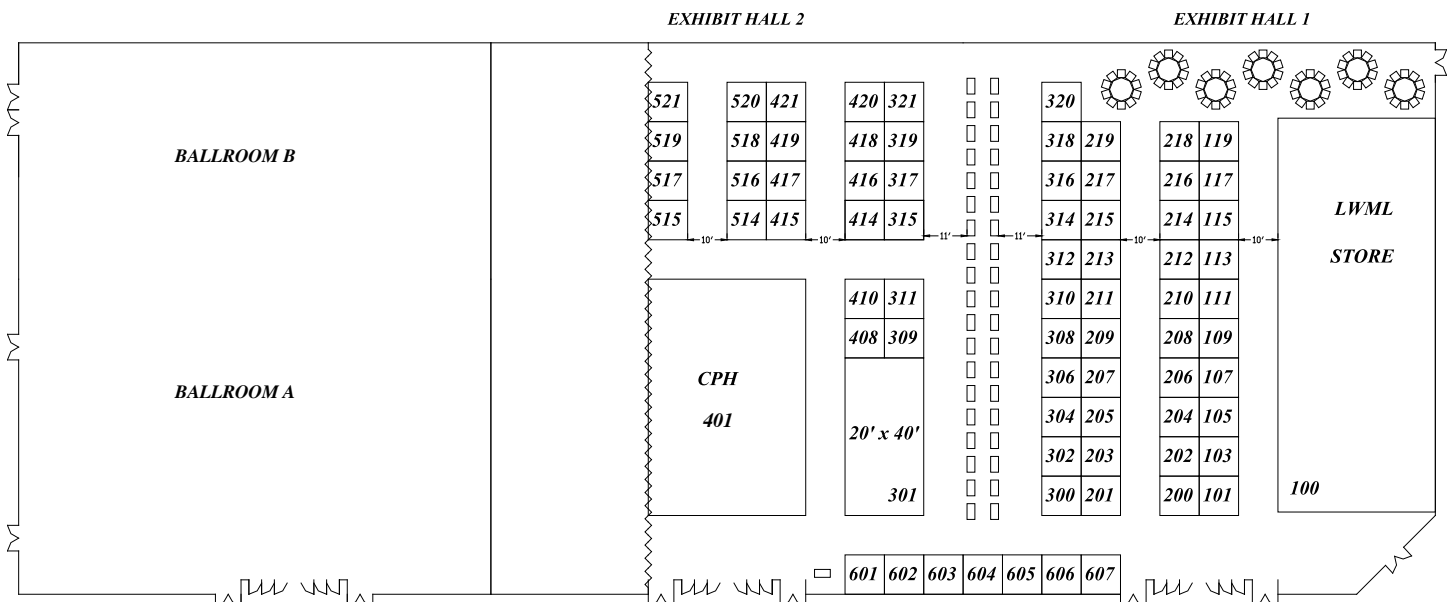

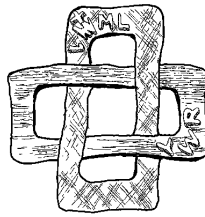
