

## Blessed to be a Blessing

he women at Trinity Lutheran Church in Sheboygan, Wisconsin (**LWML South Wisconsin District**) have revamped their LWML society structure from a meeting to more of an event or fellowship. They meet weekly to collect mites, have Bible study, and work on a servant project. In September 2019, Rita Whittow from Bethany Lutheran Church in Milwaukee joined them and spoke about how God is faithfully providing for her church's ministry to the very poor and homeless in their community. After hearing Rita speak, the group began making fleece blankets for Bethany's outreach ministry to the homeless.

This "Bethany Project for the Homeless" continued through the next months and the congregation was invited to donate items for Blessing Bags to be given to Bethany Lutheran for distribution to the homeless. Enough cereal bars, new socks, washcloths, bath soap, shampoo, lotion, toothpaste, toothbrushes, chap sticks, and gallon zip bags were collected to assemble 200 Blessing Bags. The congregation's day school also got involved, and the school children collected well over 1,500 paper grocery bags for Bethany Lutheran's food pantry. Students wrote personal notes and put them in each blessing bag as they prayed for the recipient of the bag.

"What a joy it was for six Lutheran Women in Mission to take a 50-mile road trip to Bethany, located in a very poor area of Milwaukee, to deliver the Blessing Bags, 18 fleece blankets, and all those grocery bags!" exclaims LWML member Diane Meyer. "Our hearts were filled with joy that we were able to be part of this mission outreach. We are so blessed!"
