Their mission goal is met through leadership training, creating Christ-centered materials in the Hmong language, church planting, and mentoring pastors, vicars, servant leaders, and Christians who participate in outreach ministry to the Hmong people. Outreach ministry includes the Hmong Language School and New Year's festival outreach with Christ-centered resources in the Hmong language.

With money from this grant, St. Paul Hmong Outreach will continue their mission and expand it into other LCMS districts with large Hmong populations. They will be able to develop new modules, support training, and provide Christcentered educational materials to reach Hmong families.
