Final Mission Grant Payments Made to Grateful Recipients

LWML Mission Grant #19 — Lutheran Braille Workers

After a full tour of the Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) headquarters in Yucaipa, California, Michelle Jenks, LWML Strategic Plan Facilitator, presented the \$100,000 mission grant check to the staff and volunteers at LBW.

There were smiles all around as the staff shared that this grant would be used to support the printing of Spanish Bibles for Central and South America.* LBW is the only organization in the world that prints free Braille Bibles in Spanish and there is 10 years' worth of orders for these Bibles which will amount to the production of 440,000 books.

* The original grant proposal was for Sharing Jesus' Love in India. After receiving a request from LBW, at the October 2022 LWML Board of Directors (BOD) meeting the BOD approved reallocating the distribution of the \$100,000 from India to Central and South America. It is our prayer that God's Word will be shared in India one day soon.

LWML Mission Grant #7 — Training Pastors to Serve the Church in Russia

Even as international conflict persists, LWML mites were sent to the Siberian Lutheran Mission Society in Ft. Wayne, Indiana in support of the Lutheran Theological Seminary, Novosibirsk, Siberia. Novosibirsk is far from the battle lines, but the impact of the conflict is being felt as inflation rises, young men are being drafted into military service, and people's anxiety over the future increases. Even so, the seminary is still working to prepare future pastors to proclaim the Gospel to people in Siberia and other parts of Russia, as well as people in Kazakhstan and Ukraine, including seminarians looking to the seminary in Novosibirsk for their pastoral education. Professors have become adept at conducting some of their classes online, a necessity during the pandemic and now critical for reaching students who are close to the conflict.

Please continue to pray for the professors and seminary students in Siberia as they work to further God's Kingdom in the midst of these difficult times.
