



Mission Grant Summaries

The following are summaries of the last four of 28 mission grants adopted during the 2021–2023 biennium. We praise God that all 28 mission grants have been paid, and we prayerfully continue our faithful contributions in support of the new mission grants adopted at the 2023 LWML Convention in Milwaukee.

25. Missionaries to America Project — Mission Nation Publishing \$88,000 PAID

The purpose of Mission Nation's "Missionaries to America" project is helping the LCMS strengthen its capacity to share Jesus with people of different cultures and languages. With this grant, Mission Nation Publishing will provide resources for people to be better witnesses for Jesus to ethnic groups.

26. Strengthening the Lutheran Mission to Kuna, Idaho, Friendship Celebration Lutheran Church \$100,000 PAID

A new church has been planted in Kuna, Idaho. The congregation wants to build their own sanctuary and other facilities in order to conduct growing congregational activities, but they are first in need of a parcel of land. This grant is assisting in the purchase.

27. Expanding God's Love in Uganda, LCMS Office of International Mission, Africa Region \$92,000 PAID

The Lutheran Church of Uganda (LCU) has requested LCMS assistance to train deaconesses to assist the Lutheran pastors throughout Uganda as they teach the faith, provide spiritual care, and show mercy to the communities. This grant allows for a land purchase adjacent to the established Lutheran Theological College, Uganda, fencing, and a small dormitory for the women.

28. Christ-Centered Materials for Hmong Language School and Outreach, St. Paul Hmong Outreach Ministries \$78,364 PAID

St. Paul Hmong Outreach Ministries in Merced, California, has been actively involved in outreach to Hmong communities for 15 years. LWML mission grant funds continue to support mission programs, develop new training modules, and support training implementation of Christ-centered educational materials in the Hmong language.
