## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR GARY KOLTZ

Many people know Advent as a time of expectation, waiting, and preparation for both the celebration of Jesus' birth and his return or second coming. Advent is also the beginning of anew church year. What a fitting way to start the new liturgical church year with a celebration; a birthday celebration for Jesus. We prepare our hearts and minds for this wondrous event with many symbols that remind us of Jesus.

The celebrations usually starts with the <u>Christmas tree</u>. We think of the Tree of the cross on which our Savior gave His life for our redemption. An evergreen tree is God's reminder to us that He comes to us and is ever-living. Trees were first used in German Paradise Plays portraying the creation of mankind. They were later decorated in the woods as part of the Christmas celebration, eventually being brought into homes. Martin Luther is credited with being the first to put lights on trees, symbolizing the beauty of the sly and stars. He had sseen the sky refelecting off the snow covered tree and wanted his wife and children to share in the experience.



The <u>wreath</u> is a circle of evergreens reminding us of the never-encing love of God and the eternal glories He holds before us.

<u>Chrismons</u> are Christmas decorations with Christian symbols on them. They help Christians to remember that Christmas is the celebration of Jesus' birthday. They are often used on Christmas Trees in Churches and Christians homes. I hope this list of Chrismons below will help you in this season of Advent to prepare for our saviour's arrival.



The Cross symbolizes that Christians believe Jesus Christ died for everyone on a cross.



The <u>Celtic Cross</u> is a normal cross with a circle in the middle to symbolize eternity.



The <u>Anchor</u> cross reminds Christians that Jesus is the anchor of their faith. HIS are the first three letters of "Jesus" in Greek.





The <u>Fish</u> is one of the oldest Christian symbols. The letters are from the Greek word for fish (ichthus) that stands for Jesus (i), Christ (X), God, (Q), Son (Y), Savior (S). Some of Jesus' disciples were fishermen.

Alpha and Omega are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet.. Used together, they symbolize that Christians believe Jesus is the beginning and end of all things.



The <u>Chi-Rho</u>looks like a "P" with an "X" on top of it. These two letters are the first two letters of the Greek word "Christos" which means Christ.



A Five Pointed Star represents the five wounds of Jesus on the cross.

The Nativity Star is the symbol of the Star of Bethlehem or Epiphany, when the Wisemen visited Jesus.



An Eight Pointed Star represents baptism and regeneration.

The Nativity Star is the symbol of the Star of Bethlehem or Epiphany, when the widemen visited Jesus.



The Crown is the symbol that Jesus is King. It shows that Christians believe Jesus is ruler over heaven and earth.



The Shepherd's Crook or Staff remembers that Jesus sometimes called Himself a shepherd. It can also represent the shepherds who were the first people told about the birth of Jesus.

Hands in Prayer help Christians remember that they should pray to Jesus.



The Scroll represents the Bible.



The Dove is the symbol of peace and the Holy Spirit. It is shown pointing down to represent the Holy Spirit that appeared as a Dove when Jesus was baptized.



The Lamp and The Candle both represents that Christians believe Jesus in the Light of the World.



The Shell is a symbol for baptism. It reminds Christians of the water that they are baptized in. It is also a sign of Pilgrimage, as Pilgrims to the Holy Land (Israel) would use a shell as a drinking vessel.



The Ship is also a symbol of the Church, sailing towards heaven.



The Cup or Chalice is a symbol of the Mass, Eucharist or Communion. It also represents God's forgiveness.



The Angel reminds Christians of the angels who told the shepherds about the birth of Jesus. It can also represent the second coming of Jesus, which the Bible says will start with an Angel blowing a trumpet.



**<u>Babe/Manger</u>** represents Jesus as a baby at Christmas.



The **Lamb** is a symbol for Jesus who is sometimes called "The Lamb of God".



The **Butterfly** is a symbol for transformation and the immortal soul.



The **Heart** is a symbol of love and reminds Christians that God is love.

As we await the arrival of the new born King may each of the symbols remind us of the hope born out of wall that our Lord has done and will do for all of humanity. Jesus brings peace to us now in a world filled with trouble. His peace knows no boundaries or end. There is joy in Jesus as the angels declared at his birth to the shepherds—Rejoice.

Christmas is a time to rejoice and celebrate its miracle. Love is the very core of the Christian story, it's something that we receive from Jesus and that we have to share with one another. Finally, remember to let your light shine in the darkness. Jesus is the source of light, our hope, joy, peach, and giver of love.




## **MUSIC NOTES**
