We will explore **Exodus 32:7-14** While Moses is on Mount Sinai, the people grow restless and make a golden calf



to worship. Today's reading shows Moses as the mediator between an angry God and a sinful people. Moses reminds God that the Israelites are God's own people, and boldly asks for mercy for them. Our gospel reading **Luke 12:32-40** Jesus encourages disciples to invest their hearts and live fully into God's reign. Instead of facing life with fear, those who know God's generosity are always ready to receive from God and to give to others.

Wednesday, September 21th, we will study **Amos 6:1a, 4-7 T**he prophet Amos announces that Israel's great wealth is a cause not for rejoicing but rather sorrow, because God's people have forgotten how to share their wealth with the poor. The wealthy will be the first to go into exile when judgment comes. Our gospel reading **Luke 16:19-31** Jesus tells a parable in which the poor one is "lifted up" and the rich one is "sent away empty." Jesus makes it clear that this ethic of merciful reversal is not new but is as old as Moses and the prophets.

Please plan to attend and invite someone else along. The discussion is always fascinating as the Holy Spirit guides our thoughts and understanding.

Pastor's Report for July 2022

Worship Services, visitations, committee meetings, community commitments were attended as well as MCMA and GRO Board meetings via Zoom or in person. In July, I presided over 5 Sunday worship services, and 4 Wednesday night Worship & Praise Services all with Zoom and Live Streamed on Facebook. There was an additional Sunday worship service at Allure Nursing Home. On Sunday, we continue to communion at the front of the Church. Our Video/Media technicians continue to do a superb job of handling all the extra online traffic particularly with the added mid-week Worship & Praise service. They also covered our remote service at Timber Lake. Praise God that our musicians and technicians are stepping up to cover the extra load.

This month we had a Celebration of Life and Memorial service for Greg Bazilewich in which everyone pitched in to make this a memorable moment for friends and family. Greg will be greatly missed within our congregation and in the community at large. We attended a diakonia Graduation and Thanksgiving Service in Rockford, for four of our folks from First Lutheran: Liz Rath, Jo Lyn Kruse, Bonnie Schroeder and Karen Davis. They were presented with Graduation Certificates and a diakonia cross.

Five Minutes of Fame is back underway on the third Tuesday of the month. We had a beautiful day for our Christmas in July Service and Weapon of Prayer did a fantastic job with Christmas music for that service. Great River Outreach provided a delicious hot lunch. We had 40 people attend and everyone stayed for lunch. Body & Soul, supper and a Bible study met for the fourth time since the beginning of Covid at the Church on July 31st and it was hosted by Pat Erdmann and her dear friend Nancy. This monthly event will be held at different homes each month. It attracted 16 people for a wonderful dinner and interesting look at the upcoming Gospel reading. Next month's will be hosted by Barb and Pastor Bob.

Our work with GRO on Main Street is not going unnoticed within Carroll County thanks to your ongoing support. This month there were several outreach opportunities including Open Mic at Bridges and GRO's Radio-a-Thon which raised \$15,650 to help us in this important mission. I was pleased to see so many of our members volunteering, dropping by and calling in their pledge of support that Saturday morning.

Dennis Yochem moved to accept the Treasurer's, Financial Secretary's, and Memorial Treasurer's reports. Pat Erdmann seconded the motion and the motion passed. Brian moved that the treasurer pay the church bills presented to the Finance Committee this past month. Jo Lyn seconded the motion and the motion passed.
