#### Highlights from the Voters Meeting Summary–Jan. 21, 2024

Pastor gave his official acts report for October-December including; the baptism of Jacob Cansino; adult confirmation for Art & Lisa Jern and Bill Byers; Thanksgiving, Advent and Christmas services; assisting in the Children's Christmas Service; leading Tuesday morning Bible Study; leading chapel for preschool along with classroom visits and Bible stories; pastors meetings in the circuit and the district; performing the wedding of JoAnn and Anson Wing; and talking about the upcoming Lenten services and pastor rotation.

The Treasurers report stated that Endowment Fund has been gaining over the last several months and the designated funds continue to increase due to giving. In Q2, the operating fund increased. Overall, the designated funds increased mainly due to the giving towards the building fund. So even with the operating income being under budget, the decrease in operating expense was even to offset the shortage. Hopefully we can keep the lower expenses trend going and increase envelope and plate giving in Q3.

Stewardship will be meeting on January 28th to talk about plans for the year. They were thanked for providing todays lunch.

**Education:** 

Sunday school has resumed normal classes after the Christmas Children's Service in December. Jr/Sr high Sunday School is working on reading through and learning the book of John for the upcoming April 7th Circuit Bible Bowl.

Youth are thankful for all those who supported the fall and winter fundraisers: Harvest Houses, The circuit sock collection, silent auction baskets, and Christmas houses. They have several upcoming circuit youth events—movie night on Jan 28th and Higher Things in a Box lock-in in Feb.

Preschool has been busy celebrating Thanksgiving and Christmas. Several fieldtrips include the library, Pizza House and GHAS visit and collected items for Safe Harbor, Rescue Mission and Women's Pregnancy Center during our Show & Share times! We are celebrating National Lutheran Schools Week and are having a Preschool Scholarship Fund Drive which allows up to support those families who need tuition assistance. Cassandra finished her classes and earned her degree from Carl Sandburg College. Way to go Cassandra!

Please welcome and introduce yourself to our new members. Confirmation date options are being discussed with the confirmand families. Lenten services will begin on Ash Wednesday at 6pm. No meal that evening. On the following Wednesday evenings there will be a pastoral rotation for preaching and meals served by church committees. Dinner will be at 5pm, service will be at 6pm every week. Marc Kugler has been elected as chairman of the Elders.

Properties reported that several security cameras have been placed around the church. We have purchased an AED and it is in the mailroom in case of an emergency. Several annual inspections have occurred in December and January, with no issues/violations. Work continues on figuring out the issue with the tv in the sanctuary. We will be installed a furnace in the boiler room to prevent frozen pipes. Properties and Evangelism will be teaming up to serve a pancake Lenten supper on March 20th.

The Building Committee thanks all who have supported our fundraisers thus far and hope that we can all keep working towards our goal! We received a very generous check from Pastor Larner's estate that was earmarked for the building fund. 

#### **Lenten Blessings**

Do you have young children? It's so hard to do the running and practices and make Lenten services, but I promise you – those services and the gravity and intensive focus on the Passion of Jesus are THE MOST MEMORABLE PARTS OF MY FAITH FORMATION. God's Word does its work with the old Lenten hymns to help drive home the importance of Jesus and His redeeming work; as well as, what's most important in your home. Please use these evening services to shape your family as a family that walks together under the cross! Let this be a good time to begin or continue a family practice of being together around the family altar in your home, and here with God's children.

How can Lent be a blessing for you? Ash Wednesday starts February 14! This year Mt Calvary will offer Lenten services of prayer and preaching led by area pastors from our circuit congregations. Our theme focuses on the accusations and temptations Jesus faced - - God on Trial. (We will be joined by Pastors Sommerer, Astrowski, Corigan, Eddy, Hagen and Umbarger, in that order.) All services will begin at 6pm; meals begin Feb.21 and following weeks at 5pm-ish.

How blessed we are to have these opportunities together to focus on the Passion of Christ — God on Trial. Too easily we forget God not only calls us to eternal life through faith, but also calls us to serve Him with lives of love and good works within our respective vocations. Lent is a time of repentance and renewal, putting to death our sinful flesh - a time of Godly discipline. In that respect Lent is a "Baptismal season", because in Lent we daily drown our sinful flesh in repentance and rise to life with Christ in the power of His Word.

The root of discipline is disciple and that's what God calls each of us to be. Our lives of discipleship get derailed by undisciplined lives focused too much on worldly things. Discipline is important. Through Godly disciplines we learn our failures and weakness and dependence on Jesus. Through Godly disciplines we remember our privilege of serving God by serving others. Through Godly disciplines we learn that faith passively rests in Jesus' work, trusting in Him for salvation, even as we actively serve God in the world.

The Lenten focus on repentance and Christ's sufferings and death is a great blessing. In our self-centered world, the Holy Spirit would change our hearts and direct us to Christ through faith and to our neighbor in love. How blessed if we learn in Lent to confess our sins to God our Father through Christ our Lord. Opportunities for individual confession and absolution are offered with pastor during Lent – anytime by appointment. The Portals of Prayer and reading through the Gospels helps us center our homes and lives in God's Word. Fasting is encouraged (see Matt.6) as an opportunity to lay aside those things (food, social media, TV, etc) that dominate our attentions, dedicating that time and energy to God's Word and prayer. Works of love and service are encouraged as loving responses to the Savior's free forgiveness.

Use this season... God's Church throughout the ages has wisely set aside these times to help us to grow more deeply in our appreciation for Jesus' sacrifice. Use this Lenten season to read through the Gospels at home. Set aside time for prayer. Join us here at church on Sundays and Wednesday evenings. May these good Godly disciplines of Lent help you to focus on Christ. You and I aren't saved by the things we do through Lent. We were saved by what Jesus did at the cross and are saved by what He gave in Holy Baptism and gives in His Holy Supper. (Indeed, what Jesus did at the cross comes to us in no other way that through God's Word and Sacraments.) God's grace is a precious treasure. Lent is a good time to grow in our joyful certainty that Christ has won our final victory. By the power of God's Holy Spirit, "Fix your eyes on Jesus, the Author and Perfecter of your faith" (Heb.12:2).

Special meals will be provided Wednesday evenings beginning Feb.21 with the Youth around 5-ish so people coming from work won't have to cook. Services are all at 6pm. We pray that will enable more to attend. Praise God for this wonderful season of renewal in His Word! A blessed, focused Lenten journey will truly lead to a joyous Easter celebration!
