

In a few days the new church year begins starting with Advent season.

The term "Advent" finds its roots in the Latin word "adventus," signifying "coming" or "arrival." This season provides a contemplative space to ponder the initial arrival of Jesus as a baby in Bethlehem and to ready our hearts for His anticipated second coming in glory.

But how do we make ready?

Our traditions play a pivotal role in this preparation. The illumination of Advent candles symbolizes various facets of the season: hope, peace, joy, and love. They serve as a poignant reminder of God's promises and the imminent arrival of the Light of the World.

Mid-week Advent services offer a respite from the frenetic pace of the season, allowing us to pause and reflect on God's words and promises. Through these services, we revisit the Old Testament promises foretelling the advent of our Savior.

Daily devotions help to keep us vigilant. Jesus told us to be watchful and faithful, for we do not know the day or hour of His return. Live your life in a way that reflects your faith and hope in Christ. Share His love with others and forgive.

Blessings to you all this Advent season as we eagerly prepare for the birth of our Savior and the triumphant return of our Lord.




## Church decorating
