Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

Lent begins in just a few weeks. I find it interesting that this year Lent begins on Valentine's Day and Easter is the day before April Fool's Day. I think there is sermon material in those connections. Even though Lent is a penitential season, the season of Lent is God's Valentine gift to us because the season is a forty-day journey that ultimately points us to the love of Jesus shown to us through the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. And, of course, with Easter being the day before April Fool's Day – the last laugh is on the devil who was defeated at the cross and through the resurrection death was also defeated.

The Lenten series that we will be using at our midweek Lenten services is entitled "The Seven Signs of Jesus's Divinity." Throughout Lent we will be looking at the various signs of Jesus – Jesus turning water into wine; the healing of the Nobleman's Son; the healing of the man at the pool; the feeding of the 5000; Jesus' walking on the water; the healing of the man born blind; and the raising of Lazarus.

At our midweek Lenten services we will be hearing from different Pastors in the Cincinnati area. Our services will be on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. with a meal starting at 6:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall.

During Lent we will have opportunity to prepare ourselves through the Word of God to receive the Lord Jesus that will be communicated through Holy Week and then ultimately on Easter Sunday. "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son that whoever believes in Him will not perish but will have everlasting life."





Messiah LWML Lutheran Women in Mission is happy to report that the LWML Ohio District has received and paid in full \$116,400.00 for grants during 2022-2023.

Good Shepherd of the Deaf, Toledo, Ohio, requested and received a grant of \$1,400 on August 7, 2022, to purchase a monitor for their sanctuary. This church has a strong desire to preach God's love to the deaf, the hard-of-hearing, and the hearing alike. One major way of communicating in the deaf community is through pictures that serve as symbols. Pastor Shirrel Petzoldt detailed Joe and his son Chris worked many Sundays to make this possible. This monitor helps the choir see the music, but also helps Pastor Shirrel understand the sermon and symbols to spread God's Word.
