- P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: Alleluia! Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!
- P: Do you believe in the one Lord, your God Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?
- C: Yes. May the name of the living Lord be praised!
- P: But you are only able to say, "Jesus is Lord" by the power of the Holy Spirit.

- C: The Spirit of God has created within us a living faith in our Savior, Jesus Christ, who on this day rose from the dead. He is alive and lives with us, within us, and for us!
- P: How were you brought to this faith?

- P: The abundant, forgiven, and eternal life is a gift from God rejoice in it always. Revel in his gifts of love and life, and gracefully follow in his ways.



CONFESSION OF OUR SINS AND RECEIVING GOD'S FORGIVENESS

- P: The transformation of our lives and God's world begins with the acknowledgement that Jesus is Lord over sin, death, and the devil. Then we come to him, confessing our sins, seeking his gracious forgiveness. With sincere hearts and minds, let us confess our sins.
 - Lord Jesus Christ, you are the Victor over death and the grave. You have risen from the tomb. We also want to rise victoriously over the death and defeat which we face every day.
- C: We confess, Lord, that we so easily live only for ourselves. We have neglected to live whole-heartedly for you and others.
- P: We are trapped in the tombs of self-centeredness. We need the power of your forgiveness. Roll away the stone of sin and crush the hardness of our heart.
- C: Forgive us! Let us die to sin and be raised to new life in you, through your resurrection. Make us alive in you! Amen.
- P: Jesus has carried our sins to his own death. His sacrifice is complete and full. He has won the victory! He is your living,

personal, and sure Redeemer. Hardened hearts are crushed! Stone walls of sin have been rolled away! Alleluia! In Jesus' name, and by his command, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- C: Amen! We have been forgiven! We have been restored to new life in Christ! Alleluia!
- P: Alleluia! Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!



THE OLD TESTAMENT READING

Isaiah 25:6-9

R: The Old Testament Reading for the Resurrection of Our Lord is from the 25th chapter of Isaiah.

On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wine, of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined. And he will swallow up on this mountain the covering that is cast over all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations. He will swallow up death forever; and the Lord GOD will wipe away tears from all faces, and the reproach of his people

he will take away from all the earth, for the LORD has spoken. It will be said on that day, "Behold, this is our God; we have waited for him, that he might save us. This is the LORD; we have waited for him; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation."

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE READING I Corinthians 15:1-11

R: The Epistle Reading is from the 15th chapter of First Corinthians.

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you - unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

THE HOLY GOSPEL Mark 16:1-8

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 16th chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you." Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone because they were afraid.


P: This is the Gospel of the Lord.
