Messiah might be getting a vicar! What's that? What do they do? Why are we doing this?

Messiah has applied to participate in the vicarage program through the two LCMS seminaries. A vicar is simply a man who is a student, studying at the seminary to become a pastor. Your "vicarage" is a year of practical, in-the-field experience at a congregation which has invited to host you. Most men serve as vicars during their 3<sup>rd</sup> year out of 4 of

seminary training (like I did). My vicarage was at Hope Lutheran Church in Warren, Michigan from the summer of 1997-1998. I still remember fondly many of the people there and cherish the valuable lessons learned during that time. A couple years ago, I even returned to serve as guest preacher as part of their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration. **Some, however, delay vicarage** until after coursework is complete, and often are assigned to a "convertible" vicarage - in which after serving for a year of internship they may remain and become pastor (if mutually agreeable), or else be assigned as a pastor elsewhere. Our current seminary student adoptee, Mark Peters, will be going this route in the Spring. (We will therefore be designating a new seminary student adoptee this year, by the way.) Usually the vicar comes in the mid-summer sometime after finishing up classwork and seminary responsibilities for the year. Sometimes they are single, sometimes married, sometimes even with a large family. Often times they are young men (mid-twenties), but can also be older "second career" students.

A vicar's main purpose is to learn, through practice, what it is to be a pastor. Therefore he will be given opportunities to preach, teach, visit, observe meetings, observe events, and participate in various ways in the life and operation of the congregation. He will be supervised by the pastor and receive directions and evaluations per the seminary's usual process. It is possible to "fail" a vicarage, but most men successfully complete their year and go on to finish their studies and serve at their own congregation. What a vicar cannot do: Officiate at weddings, funerals, or preside over the Lord's Supper (though he may assist in all of these if appropriate). He doesn't act on his own, but always under the authority of the pastor, who remains responsible for him as well. The congregation ought to remember, at all times, the vicar is a student, and therefore afford him an extra degree of grace and patience as he practices his skills and certainly makes mistakes along the way.

Very often congregations form a strong bond with their vicars. It is an exciting time when a new vicar comes and also bittersweet when a man finishes his year and departs. Some congregations participate in the vicarage program for many years. Which, by the way, brings me to another point the purpose of the vicarage. While it is often a blessing to the pastor and the congregation to benefit from the work a vicar does, he is not simply to be seen as "cheap labor" or a lackey for the pastor to dish off unwanted duties. Rather, the congregation is investing significant resources in supporting this man for the year, and in providing him with a crucible in which to learn valuable lessons about the ministry. We are therefore serving both the vicar and the church at large in helping in the formation of a future pastor. It should be seen primarily as one way in which Messiah fulfills the Great Commission, so that the Gospel of Jesus Christ can further be preached unto the ends of the earth. After all, how will they hear, if no one is sent to preach to them? (Romans 10:14) Sometime in early to mid-April, we should receive word if we will be assigned a vicar or not. Last year, we also applied, and were not assigned one due to a smaller number of assignments needed. If we do receive one, he could be from either the St. Louis or Fort Wayne seminary, and will be assigned in late April (around the 21st or so, usually) at a special service at the seminary. Many will be eagerly watching, even online, as this is always the first announcement of vicarage assignments. I'll provide the information to you, of course, if it works out.

If you have questions about the vicarage program, or ideas on how you might be of service to the vicar and his family (if he has one), please let me or the Elders know. Please pray for him, as you hopefully do for your pastor and your congregation. And, Lord willing, we will all be a blessing to each other in the year to come.

That you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name. —John 20:31



Have you heard the recent news that the Governor of Arkansas signed legislation banning nearly all abortions? The Bill lists the following five reasons why abortion was banned in the State of Arkansas:

- 1) Abortion is a crime against humanity.
- 2) New evidence shows life begins at conception.
- 3) Abortion hurts women.
- 4) Abortion is unneeded for reliance by women who can now relinquish their children for free up to thirty days after birth through Ark Safe Haven Law.
- 5) 1-2 million women per year are waiting to adopt newborns.

Are you struggling with sadness or guilt from a past abortion? You are not alone. There is forgiveness and restoration in Christ! Just under one in four women, about 24% in the US, will have at least one abortion before they turn 45 years old; and nearly four in ten, among these women, claim to be church goers. Are you suffering from Post Abortion Syndrome (PAS) and want to find out more about the forgiveness that comes from Christ through the Gospel? You are not alone.

Silence from the past traumatic experience of an abortion leaves pain that is invisible to friends and family. An invisible pain that disrupts current relationships and eternal restoration. An internalized pain brought about by sin, that Christ has overcome on the cross. Silence is darkness, but Jesus Christ is the Light of the World (John 8:12)—the Light no darkness can overcome (John 1:5). Break the silence; extinguish the pain. Let the Word of the Lord wipe away every tear from your eye (Rev 21:4).

Jesus is the answer to our restoration and there is comfort to be found through the cross. By His perfect life, death, and resurrection, Christ brings us hope. Hope is not a probability; it is a promise. Hope is not a possibility; it is an inheritance. God guards our inheritance by giving us a new identity in Christ. As a baptized child of God, we have a living hope:

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to His great mercy, He has caused us to be **born again** to a **living hope** through the **resurrection of Jesus Christ** from the dead, to an **inheritance** that is **imperishable**, undefiled, an unfading, **kept in heaven** for you, who by God's power are being guarded through **faith** for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. 1 Peter 1:3-5

Our hope in Christ is a living hope. Our identity comes from Christ's victory. St. Paul tells us in Romans 8:37 that, "You are more than a conqueror through Him who loved us." What exactly does it mean to be "more than a conqueror?" This means you are an heir to The Conqueror—your identity is now in Christ—and those things you do today, through faith as a forgiven child of God, are done as an ambassador of Christ. Therefore, when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up, remember your identity in Christ. Music Update: Are we DONE yet?

As you may remember, we have been working through the process of learning a new set of music for the communion liturgy, also known as "Divine Service Setting 2," the only setting in our hymnal we had not been using before. Our approach, as recommended by our synod's leading church musicians, had been piecemeal, learning one section at a time. In Advent, we all sang the new Kyrie together, and at Christmas, the choir led us in singing the new Gloria. Throughout Lent, we visited the Agnus Dei, and on Easter Sunday the choir

sang the Alleluia and the Offertory. However, the mix-and-match approach we had been following meant that those who relied primarily on the hymnal to follow the service, instead of the bulletin, were having to flip back and forth between services, which was confusing to many. In light of this, we decided to change our approach. About halfway through Lent, we stopped mixing the musical settings of the liturgy, and with the choir singing two parts themselves on Easter, we have now introduced all parts of the new service except for one: the *Sanctus*.

Messiah is no ordinary congregation when it come to singing. We easily out-sing congregations twice our size, and judging from the sound I perceive from the back of the sanctuary, it is hard to imagine many congregations achieving a higher singing decibel to congregant ratio. We sing even the more difficult hymns with enthusiasm, confidence, and a conviction that bespeaks the determination with which we believe that of which we sing. I cannot tell you how many days the sound of the united voices on Sunday lifts my spirit in ways that little else can. I have become convinced there is nothing this church cannot sing. I believe, after the insistence of several members, we are ready to "pull the trigger" and just sing the entire new setting of the liturgy from front to back in one service. And so, without further ado, we will be attempting precisely this, on Pentecost Sunday. This weekend will also be the choir's final service of the spring season, and our annual "music Sunday," so they will be in both services to assist with lesser familiar material and to teach us the new *Sanctus*. Between now and then, we will continue our use of our regular services as they are printed in the hymnal. I look forward to taking this next step in the ongoing development of our worship life together at the end of this Easter season, and I hope that you will continue join your voice not only with the choir at Messiah, but with all the angelic hosts and the saints who have gone before, as we continue proclaim, "Glory to God in the highest!"



Greetings in Christian Brotherhood!

I would like to inform the congregation about events just past and share some upcoming events. As you know the Council meets 12 times a year with 4 Voters Assemblies. We usually have one additional meeting focused solely on the Budget. Our budget runs from July 1<sup>st</sup> through June 30<sup>th</sup>. The Council has unanimously approved a draft budget for presentation to the Voters on April 25<sup>th</sup>. This budget is posted on the church bulletin board and will be disseminated via email as well. I hope everyone will review this and participate!

In addition to the Budget, some of the Council's achievements have been:

- The Treasurer reported MLCA and MLC each outperforming budget yielding a net YTD surplus of \$16,095. The Budget/Spending Plan had a YTD deficit of \$58K.
- Board of Elders published their first Annual Report, completed an Elder Responsibilities Calendar, and created and reviewed a number of policy documents related to protecting Messiah's ministry.
- Board of Education had an Easter Egg hunt between services Easter Sunday. They are planning on Vacation Bible School.
- Board of Evangelism served 16 families in mid-March with our Swaddling Clothes Ministry.
- The Board of Trustees has been very busy (as usual). Here are some highlights cleaned several offices in the MAC, began working on office space for our Deaconess, replaced the sanctuary water heater, reviewing insurance documents, annual summer maintenance for air conditioning units.
- Stewardship completed the budget and generated several scenarios for council consideration. Scheduled a retirement/estate planning workshop April 24<sup>th</sup> for all members and guests with Attorney Michele Simpson.
- MLCA Board selected Alison Smith as Principal after a very thorough search and interviewing several very qualified
  candidates, current enrollment is 71, 2021-22 enrollments are at 49 slightly ahead of last year at this time, the
  2021-22 calendar has been approved, re-accreditation is in progress, and contracts are to be issued after budget
  approval by the voters.

Major Council goals for this year are transparency, efficiency, and establishing year-to-year continuity among our servant leadership.
