

An Appointment We Cannot and Should

It is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment. (Hebrews 9:27)

appointment with DEATH.

The inspired writer refers, here, to physical death. We may not think of our death as an "appointment" because God has not revealed to us the day which He has fixed for the event, but He has determined it, for God numbered our



days before we were born (Psalm 139:16). Not only has God numbered our days, but He also implores us, through the Psalmist, to number them (Psalm 90:12). But how are we to number what we don't know? He wants us to recognize our mortality and to live this life in recognition that it will end, and that our days ARE numbered (finite). When we so consider our days as compared to human history, and especially to the concept of eternity, we recognize that life is fleeting. It appears only for a moment and then passes away. Why should we reflect upon the appointment we have with death? We do so that we may consider our priorities in this brief pilgrimage; namely, that we may PREPARE for death.

Many, if not most people today, do not prepare for death, but rather deny it and ignore the reality, as if refusing to face it openly will make it go away. Jesus shows us how foolish this philosophy is in His parable about the rich man who depended upon his earthly wealth and was not rich toward God (Luke 12:13-When, on the other hand, we recognize that everything we collect in this world will be taken away from us at death, we are highly motivated to prepare for death. But how does one prepare for death? A few very wealthy people have prepared for the preservation of their corpses so that if science discovers how to reverse death they can be revived. Most people recognize that this is a silly waste of money by eccentric people. people prepare for death by trying to immortalize their names through historical achievements or even by

having their names placed on buildings, university chairs, philanthropic gifts, etc. Others prepare by trying to accomplish as many goals as possible in their short lives (bucket lists). But all of this is just mitigating the pain of death. God calls us to prepare in a far better way.

As we face the reality of our appointment with death, let us remember that what man, with all the collected wisdom of science, will never be able to do, GOD DID. God has conquered death and He is able to reverse it. He has done this ONLY through the incarnation, life, death, and resurrection of His Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. The Bible says,

Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, he himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, ¹⁵ and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery. (Hebrews 2:14-15)

Jesus gives us a wonderful and glorious promise: "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶ and

everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die" (John 11:25-26). Jesus uses the word "death" here in two ways. First, when He acknowledges we will die ("though he die"). He speaks of physical death. Then, when He speaks of "never" dying, He refers to eternal death. Though our bodies are appointed to die, that is not our end. death is not the last word for a Christian. The Bible refers to it, both in the Old and New Testaments, as a "sleep" from which we will be awakened. Jesus refers to resurrection, and the power of resurrection is found only in Him. Why? Because He is the only "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). It is sin that causes death. Only when the quilt of sin is removed can death be reversed and conquered. When Jesus died on the cross as the innocent Son of God bearing, by imputation, the sin of the world. He removed the curse of death. On the third day, God showed this by raising Him from the dead.


How does that help us? When we are connected to Him through baptism, we are united together with both His death and His resurrection (Romans 6:3-4). That union of faith means that WE receive all the credit for His life, and that this means we follow Him from the grave to glory through eternal resurrection. Even as death has no dominion over Jesus, it no longer has dominion over those who are united to Him. "Christ has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel" (2 Timothy 1:10). We are no longer slaves to death. We no longer even fear death, for we know that death cannot hold us in its grip. Christians can say with St. Paul. "Death is swallowed up in victory!" (1 Corinthians 15:52).

Preparation, then, means renouncing all that we have in this world (repentance) and living in the righteousness of Christ that comes through faith so that we may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, that by any means possible we may attain the resurrection o f the dead." (Philippians 3:10)

We have an appointment with death, but through Christ we have another appointment, with salvation (1 Thessalonians 5:9). Thanks be to God who gives us the victory.
