In these perilous economic times. most of us are very concerned about our growing national debt. The astronomical figure staggers the imagination. No doubt one of the reasons why some are complacent about it is because the number, trillion, is extremely difficult to comprehend. An H and R Block commercial shows a man putting \$500 on every seat of a large stadium. This is an effective way to show what a billion is, especially when it is noted that this money would have to be placed on every seat of every professional football stadium in America. Now multiply that by 1000 to get one trillion. Hard to conceive isn't it? And THAT is only 1/17 of our national debt!



payment of the world comes due. The terror that seizes the hearts of even the arrogant on that day defies description. What kind of fright causes one to beg for mountains and hills to cover him from the face of God? (Luke 23:30). It is truly a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God. from Whom no one can deliver us.

The really frightening thing about the debt of sin is that it cannot be ignored forever. It MUST be paid and it will be paid. "God has fixed a day in which He will judge the world by the man He has chosen" (Acts 17:31). Paul writes, "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ so that each one may receive what is due for what he has done in the body. whether good or evil" (2 Cor 5:10). Jesus shows us the terror of the day when accounts are due through a parable in which a man owed his king more than 10 million dollars and had nothing to pay. The king commanded that he and wife and family be sold, together with everything he owned. Such a fierce judgment brought the man to his knees trembling for mercy. king heard his prayer, took pity o n him, and CANCELLED all his debt (Matt 18:23-27).

That you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing vou may have life in His name. — John 20:31

This is a wonderful picture of the law and gospel at work in our lives. Like this man in the parable, we owe God a debt that we cannot possibly pay. Our sins have separated us from God and the law requires "The wages of sin is payment. death" (Rom 6:23). Can you imagine having to stand before the throne of the holy, all knowing, all seeing God to give answer for your Not even your best works would pass the holiness test, for all our "good works" are as filthy rags b e f o r e G o d (Is 64:6). Can you imagine the Holy One peering into the deep and dark recesses of the heart and mind which Jeremiah calls "desperately wicked"? We confess with the Psalmist, "If you Lord should mark iniquity, who can stand?" (Ps 130:3). But He MUST mark it! The debt MUST be paid, for the Law requires

it. Does this judgment not lead you to cry out like the man in the parable, "Lord, have mercy!"? That is called repentance. And the good news is, "a humble and contrite heart (God) will not despise" (Ps 51:17).

God has CANCELLED our debt in the Gospel. But how? Must not the Law be fulfilled? Must not the debt be paid? How can God cancel our debt without sacrificing justice? He can do this because our debt WAS PAID. It was paid in full by Jesus who fulfilled the law by His perfectly obedient life in our place. It was paid in full by Jesus, who, though He was rich, became poor for us that through His poverty we might become rich. No single person has enough money to pay our national debt, but the Son God was rich enough to pay the debt of sin, not only for our nation but for the

whole world. The Law always accuses us and continually reminds us of the debt we owe, but the cross of Jesus reminds us that we have been redeemed, paid for, not with gold or silver, but with the precious blood of Jesus, the Lamb of God. The resurrection of Jesus is our receipt from God. Our debt HAS been paid. "It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns?" (Rom 8:33-34)

As we journey penitently through another Lent and reflect upon the price paid for our redemption, let us also remember that it all ends with a victorious cry from the cross, "It is finished!" Jesus paid our debt in full. How will you now live?

MLCA Stewardship by Bill Brandt, Board of Stewardship Chairman

Stewardship is the use of one's gifts from God in a manner appropriate with His giving. For several years our church has struggled financially. As many have noted, we simply cannot achieve our organizational financial objectives as a church without better financial performance by our school. How can our school do better financially? The answer is simple, more students. How can we get more students? Enhance the quality of the experience, and make the experience more affordable. The enhancement is taking place. We've completed initial accreditation, started an athletic program and begun a technology plan, The next step is the arrival of Mrs. Erika Mildred in June to assume duties as Headmaster. She brings a clear vision of what a Classical Lutheran school should be and a determination that all three stages of the Trivium be included.

This is a crucial success opportunity. In order to grow, we need to make the opportunity at Messiah Lutheran Classical Academy more affordable. To facilitate each of these objectives the Voter's authorized the establishment of a funding effort to:

- 1. Fund the portion of the Headmaster salary that exceeded current budget realities, and
- 2. Expand the Tuition Assistance program to get more students in our school.

Why do this?

Because this opportunity exists now to generate full classrooms under the dynamic leadership of Mrs. Mildred. Because our schoolchildren and families will become part of the light. Because if we don't, the whole financial viability of the church is at risk the next time there is a significant economic downturn. We simply can't live on the financial knife-edge we've been teetering on the past six years.

How will the Headmaster Support and Tuition Assistance Fund work?

This fund will consist of pledges from members or others connected with Messiah Lutheran Church or MLCA to make a monthly contribution for two years. These contributions will be over and above the tithe that is already contributed to support the Lord's work here at Messiah. Please don't consider

making a commitment if there is any question of it impacting your tithe. There will be a bulletin insert every week beginning the month to communicate your commitment.

What are the fund goals?

The goals are to raise \$50,000 every year for the two fiscal years, 2015 and 2016.

How will the fund be managed?

The fund will be managed by the Treasurer and the School Board. The School Board will allocate all or a portion of the fund for tuition assistance. If the tuition assistance generates enough revenue to remove the requirement to supplement the Headmaster's salary expense then it will all be devoted to tuition assistance. If not, a portion will be retained sufficient to cover the salary above the budgeted amount. The portion allocated for tuition assistance will then be apportioned according to the tuition assistance committee's recommendation.


jobs and families, do a whole lot-more hours than most
