*From the Desk of Pastor Mankin*

Greetings in Our Risen Lord!

Benjamin Franklin was right when he said nothing is certain in this life except death and taxes. This month being the month of both Easter and Tax Day brings both topics to mind. It seems that this adage is a matter of perspective— for both matters.

Death is undoubtedly a certainty in this world unless Jesus returns before then for any of us, but death is just a passing thing, temporary in the light of Easter. Good Friday represents the death that lasts. Jesus bore the cost of death and hell that each of us has earned with His body on the cross and in the tomb on that first Good Friday. One could say that because Jesus rose on the third day, that His death was only temporary and Jesus lives in eternity. However, many overlook that with the death He suffered, He not only died to sin once and for all—but for eternity. His death is eternal in some sense. It is just that working out the eternity-part and the "in time" part gets confusing for mere human brains like mine, the now and not yet sort of thing.

His death is eternal, even though we see that He rose on the third day. His death seems much shorter than—say I don't know, one of ours—because we go to our graves and, as far as my observation can determine up to this moment, we never move again. Our death, which we confess will end on that last day, is of far longer duration; although our resurrection is one with Christ's resurrection, even if separated from His resurrection in time. So, we can see that theology can be intensely confusing. His death is both three days long and eternal, while ours have no observable ending yet. And yet, our deaths are temporary because of His and end in connection with His resurrection! His death is both longer and shorter than ours.

There is a death that is eternal. That is the death of the damned—those who refuse to be saved by the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, and as such choose to go to hell, even if that is not a fully-informed choice. The unbeliever dies never to rise to life again. When the believer dies, his or her body dies, but they do not. They are received into the presence of the Lord for eternity, while they await the day of the resurrection of all flesh when they shall reunite their bodies for everlasting life in glory. That is wonderful news of Easter! When the unbelieving shed their mortal coil, their souls proceed to that place without the presence of God—to Sheol, to that place where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, to begin their eternity where the worm never dies and the fire is never quenched, to quote Jesus. On the last day, they will also be reunited with their flesh, but sent to the eternal torment of Hell. The difference from that point in time from those that believe is that the unbelieving never rise to life again, only eternal agony.

They rise, but that resurrection is not to life. Their bodies rise from the grave, and their spirits are reunited with their bodies. That much is like the believers—although the Bible does not tell us whether their bodies are raised re-outfitted for eternity or not—this not a resurrection to life. It is a resurrection to eternal death of both body and soul. It is death, however, of something other than what we observe in this world. Their souls apparently animate the flesh, but it is not quite a life. It is a resurrection to the torment of body, mind, and soul. It is a resurrection to existence without God. Without joy and peace and comfort and contentment. Beyond those few facts, there is no word of Scripture. We could try to imagine and form a conjecture, but it would be no more reliable than our imaginings about the true nature of heaven, and it would serve no useful purpose. It would just be grisly and depressing. The phrase, "No, thank you,"

springs to mind, and it is a good exhortation in every sense of the phrase.

Now, that I have managed to destroy any hope of the cheerful Easter-tide devotional that one expects in the April Newsletter, let us return to the topic: death and taxes. Although Scripture calls death the wages of sin, it is like a tax. You did the sin, and now you must pay. Your life is forfeit because you have sinned. You have earned death, but it doesn't feel like a wage as much as it seems like a penalty—like taxes. Just before two days before Tax Day, we will celebrate Jesus receiving all that we have earned by our sin, or paying the penalty of sin that we have accrued by our unholy thoughts and words and deeds. As you pay your taxes, you can comfort yourself with the thought that they are the price you pay for the blessing of prosperity in this most favored nation on earth. On Good Friday, we find comfort in the Gospel truth that Jesus has met the demands of the justice of God against our wickedness, evil, and sin.

However, sin and taxes differ in important ways. Taxes are paid. The just sentence against our sin is delivered, poured out, but emptied out upon Jesus as our Savior. Taxes are measured against good and blessing. The condemnation of Christ is measured out against evil, transgression, and sin. Taxes are law; our salvation is Gospel. No one likes taxes. They are endured; at best, they are paid as the just wages of the ministers of God in this world for order and worldly justice. Forgiveness, life, and salvation are a delight to everyone who understands what blessings they bring and the tremendous price that was given to win them for you. Taxes are a millstone, and salvation is a free gift. It removes the burden from us. Taxes are our duty but salvation is pure grace, the gift of God. Except in cases of political favoritism and monkey-business, taxes are one of the two inescapable realities of our world. The death of the body is the other inescapable reality, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23 ESV)

The resurrection of the believer is the promise of the Gospel. We rise, bodies outfitted for eternal life, and souls reunited with those bodies. We will then enjoy eternal life beyond sickness, sorrow, pain, or any form of death again. We receive all of this because of Christ Jesus, His death on our behalf and in our place, and the

promised resurrection that seals our salvation, the gift of God to all that believe the Gospel. In reality, salvation is more certain than death and taxes, and you know what they say about them!

## **FROM THE COUNCIL**

---

### **CONCORDIA ROOF REPAIR – Lisa Lindstrom**

As some of you might have noticed, Concordia recently underwent some repair and replacement of the building's roof. The previous roof was in place for 25+ years. For at least the last 5 years, leaks had been a semi-common problem when we had big rainstorms. The two years prior to the replacement Concordia spent thousands of dollars on patches and repairs that were done as stopgap measures. Last June, the School Board decided it was finally time to do a more thorough job of fixing the problem. A roofing company completed the following work: placed an entirely new gym roof; added a maintenance overlay on the main school building that is guaranteed for at least 10 years; replaced damaged and added more down spouts in the front of the school; replaced damaged wood around gutters. A separate construction company did the following repairs: replaced soffit in the front of the school; removed damaged stucco, plywood, wood, insulation etc. from the wall alongside the main entrance to the school; and re-built that exterior wall. Concordia secured a Lutheran Church Extension Fund loan of \$85,000 in order to complete this much-needed work on the school building. It is a 10-year loan with a 0% interest rate until June of this year. The Concordia School Board is requesting that each of the five association member congregations assist with fundraising so the loan can ideally be paid down as far as possible prior to interest accruing. The Council asks that Messiah's members would prayerfully consider making a donation toward this repayment effort to assist in supporting Concordia. If you wish to donate, you can include your donation in the regular offering. Make your check out to Messiah and designate on the check
