*From the Desk of Pastor Mankin*

Greetings in Christ Jesus,

As incredible as it may sound, we are in October 2017. This year we will be celebrating 500 years since Dr. Martin Luther nailed up the 95 Theses to the door in Wittenberg, Germany. This act set forth of a series of events that we are still a part of today, namely the restoration of the Gospel to the people.

In honor of this momentous anniversary, the area pastors are holding a large event to celebrate! As part of the celebration, I was asked to use skills from my former career to design and build an Altar, Pulpit, Baptismal Font, and Processional Cross. These pieces are slowly coming together, and I thought it might be nice for you to know some of the symbolism behind them.

The altar is actually fairly simple, a long rectangle with an apron. On the front of the apron are carved the words, Sola Scriptura, Sola Fide, and Sola Gratia. These were a summation of the teachings of the Reformation. That our faith is based on Scripture Alone, we are justified by Faith Alone, and this is a gift from God by Grace Alone. In between each of these phrases are carved symbols of Lutheran Roses.

The pulpit is straightforward as well. However, on the front there is a carving of the letters, VDMA, which stands for the Latin motto Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternu, which translates to "The Word of the Lord Endures Forever." Not as well-known as the three solas listed, but above this was the battle cry of the Reformation. It is based on Isaiah 40:6-8, which is quoted in 1 Peter 1:24-25. The first appearance was in the court of Frederick the Wise in 1522. It later became the official motto of the Schmalkaldic League. This was used on the flags and banners, as a symbol of unity of the Lutheran laity who were struggling to defend their

beliefs and families for the Roman Church who sought to kill them.

The baptismal font is in the shape of Noah's Ark in honor of Dr. Luther's baptismal prayer. In the prayer, he compares Baptism to how God saved his people from the Flood and is now doing the same for us. The ark sits atop an eight-sided stand. Eight-sided fonts are a tradition dating back to the First Century, because it was on the 8th Day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead. Sunday is, of course, the first day of the week, but the early Christians viewed Easter as the first day of a new world without the fear of death.

Finally, the processional cross is, of course, a cross with the Lutheran Rose at the center. This was a symbol commissioned by Dr. Luther to sum up his view of theology.

I hope knowing a little more about all of these pieces will enrich you time at the celebration. After we are finished, all of them will be headed off to our mission church in Moscow, ID. Also, if you would like to help in their final construction or even moving them to the venue please let me know.

Five hundred years ago this October, a German monk, Martin Luther, posted a list of 95 points for debate with fellow Catholic scholars and students. These Ninety-Five Theses sparked a Reformation movement that ultimately spread far beyond the Church to language, art, music, education, and politics—an era that would become one of the major turning points in world history.



Luther and the Reformers changed the world forever, despite the best efforts of powerful religious and political leaders to silence (or even kill) them. But what we celebrate this year isn't a man or a movement. What we celebrate this October is the Reformation's Gospel-centered legacy of timeless, biblical Christian teaching that humankind is saved by God's grace alone, through faith in Christ alone, on the basis of Scripture alone. Northwest Reformation 500 is an historic, once-in-a-lifetime occasion for all area Lutherans—and fellow Christians—to celebrate that, after 500 years, it's still all about Jesus.
