From the Desk of Pastor Elliott

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Let us pray: "Lord, open now my heart to hear, and through Your Word to me draw near; Let me Your Word e'er pure retain; Let me Your child and heir remain." (LSB 908) What a beautiful prayer! I commend this prayer to you as one that we should all memorize. If ever we needed to focus upon and pray for "retention," it is now. For a whole host of reasons, our abilities to memorize and recall information are waning. The problem is most evident in our young catechumens. They struggle to retain information from class session to class session.

So, what can be done? First, we all need to pray. God can do the impossible. God can shape our minds and grant us retention. In the book of Acts, the Lord opened Lydia's heart to pay attention. He can open our hearts too. So, let us beg him for a proper retention of His Word.

Second, there are habits that aid or hinder retention. Endlessly scrolling short videos are detrimental to memorization and recall. Listening to books read aloud, or even long-form interviews, can build up our listening skills and vocabulary so that we can also hear sermons and Bible Classes.

But taking time to listen isn't enough. Students need followup; we need review. I remember one young gentlemen in our church who was struggling to remember what I taught him. I told him one day that I was going to ask him what the sermon was about right after church. Lo and behold, he was able to give me a beautiful summary! We need to discuss the sermon and Bible classes with one another because knowing that conversation will take place will aid our ability to focus, remember, and recall what we heard.

Brothers and sisters, we need to be in the Word: hearing sermons, attending Bible classes, and reading the Bible at home. However, this won't do us much good unless we can retain what we hear and then apply it to our lives. Let us strive to retain the Word! And may God plant His Word in our hearts in such a way that it grows with deep roots, and in time bears much fruit!

Below is the Financial Summary through February:

- 2024 Spending Guide (SG) prorated through February: \$86,908
- 2024 Actual Offerings/Income through February: \$103,712 (19% above SG)
- 2024 Actual Expenses through February: \$71,178 (18% below SG), including funds set aside for future use: \$6,000
