#### Never Forsaken

"Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" These are the precise words, spoken in Aramaic, that our Lord uttered on the cross (Matthew 27:46). Translated, they mean, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me." It is a cry made in deep pain and loneliness. It is the cry of rejection.

It is certainly not the first time these words have been uttered. Any well catechized Jew who heard Jesus cry out would know that these are the opening words of psalm 22. Psalm 22 is a psalm of lament. In it the psalmist speaks of great opposition and feels as if God is ignoring his pleas for help and has forsaken him. It is a psalm that speaks of deep sorrow, agony and strife. Most importantly, it is a psalm about Christ.

Consider the many ways that this psalm describes the suffering of our Lord Jesus Christ at His crucifixion. Psalm 22:7–8 says, "All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads; 'He trusts in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!" In Luke 23:35–37 we read, "And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" In Psalm 22:18 it says, "they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots." John 19:23–24a tells us, "When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his garments and divided them into four parts, one part for each soldier; also his tunic. But the tunic was

seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom, so they said to one another, 'Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it shall be." Consider also Psalm 22:16, "For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet." This finds its fulfillment in the crucifixion of Jesus. This is a rich and meaningful psalm which speaks of Christ, and I encourage you to take some time to read it during this season of Lent.

Let us go back to those words, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani." Though the Psalmist initially feels that he his forsaken by God, he recalls God's faithfulness and believes that God will deliver him. These words find their highest fulfillment as they are uttered by our Lord Jesus Christ. What Jesus says is no mere poetic sentiment. The agony and suffering is real. In body and soul, Jesus was forsaken of God. That was the curse of hell and the pain of hell. The Devil rejoiced thinking he had won. He was wrong. All the attacks against of the Devil failed. On the third day Jesus Christ rose victoriously from the grave, and sin, death and hell were defeated.

Do you ever feel like the Psalmist? Alone? Forsaken? In Christ, we are never forsaken and alone. Jesus was forsaken so that we could be reconciled to God. Jesus was raised to that we could confidently say that our God is with us.
