SUNDAY OF THE PASSION PALM SUNDAY

April 14, 2019

Passion Sunday begins Holy Week---the week when we remember, contemplate, and celebrate the central events of the Christian faith. The Sunday of the Passion is a sort of microcosm of the entire Church Year; it is also reflective of the pattern of most of our lives. It begins with exuberance, praise, and loud shouts of hosanna. Then, rather abruptly, we move to the Passion of our Lord Jesus, His suffering and death for our sake on the cross. The Church Year has times of exuberance and praise, like Christmas or Pentecost. So also in our lives we sometimes experience times of great exuberance and give praise to God. Yet a sickness, a death, or a broken relationship can take us into a time of suffering or self-sacrifice. The good news of Passion Sunday is that Jesus has gone before us and prepared the way. In good times and bad, He is Lord, His mercy endures, and He brings us ever closer to that day when there will be no more sin, no more death, no more crying, no more pain. Hosanna to the Son of David!

So the crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to testify. It was also because they heard that he had performed this sign that the crowd went to meet him. The Pharisees then said to one another, "You see, you can do nothing. Look, the world has gone after him!"





LFCU offers all the typical services you would expect from a credit union: no fee checking, free, unlimited in-network ATM transactions nationwide, on-line banking, free bill pay, and mobile banking, savings accounts, certificates of deposit (CDs), loans (home mortgage, auto, motorcycle, and personal), credit cards. Although LFCU is an on-line institution, it offers 30,000 in-network ATMs nation-wide and 5,000 walk-in locations through the "Shared Branching" network of participating credit unions. There are 10 shared branches and 54 ATM locations in the Greater Omaha area. (For example, the ATM closest to our church is in the Hy-Vee store on North 30th Street.)
