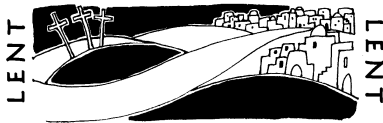

The Sunday of the Passion

March 29, 2014

This day is called Palm Sunday as well as the Sunday of the Passion. This dual naming reveals a twofold emphasis. The service begins with a processional order—commemorating King Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem on the back of a donkey. There He is beheld and welcomed by worshipers who have paved His pathway both with palm branches and articles of their clothing, crying out, “Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!” Similarly, we wave our own palm branches with which we proclaim the glory, laud, and honor due our blessed Savior, who comes among us in His Word and Sacraments. Nevertheless, as that first Palm Sunday pageantry shortly gave way to the persecution of Passion Week, so also the liturgy today swiftly transitions from tones of triumph to those of lamentation. As the Passion narrative from Mark is read, our rejoicing is subdued, as we earnestly anticipate the joyful Easter acclamation eight days hence.

Palm branches are distributed in preparation for the procession.

Brothers and sisters in Christ: In the five weeks of Lent we have been preparing for this week, the events of our Lord's death and resurrection. The great and wondrous paschal mystery now lies before us as we enter with Christ with palms and hosannas before He confronts the cross. Everything in Lent points to this week. As we commemorate how our Lord entered to the welcome of palms and hosannas, we also remember His death that gives us life and His resurrection through which we dwell with Him for all eternity.

PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL

Mark 11:1-11

Jesus' entry into Jerusalem.

The holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the eleventh chapter.

Glory to you, O Lord! (*shouted*)

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.


