**PASCHAL CANDLE** – The Paschal candle burns near the altar through the Day of Pentecost and then it is placed near the baptismal font and lit for baptisms. For funerals it stands at the head of the casket. The paschal candle represents the risen Christ shining in the splendor of the resurrection. The five wax nails represent Christ’s five wounds. Thank you to the daughters of Laura Heise, Loreen and Noreen, who have donated a new Paschal candle stand in her memory. It is located behind the Baptismal font in the narthex.

**OUR MISSIONARIES** — We invite your continued prayerful and financial support of our missionaries abroad: Julie Lutz and family in Papua, New Guinea (medical missionary), and Sharon Owens and family in Macau. **EVER WANTED TO BE A FOREIGN MISSIONARY?** — Mission Matthew 28 (MM28) is a non-profit mission that recruits, trains, and sends individuals, families, and groups to teach and witness in Hong Kong. It began as an outreach mission of Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church, but is now an independent organization. These lay missionaries teach everything from math and English to religion during the week. On weekends, they lead or assist with Sunday School and youth programs at local churches. They live and work on campuses of schools sponsored by the Lutheran Church – Hong Kong Synod. Opportunities to serve include short term stays (10 days to one month) and longer term commitments (calendar year, 9-month school year, and six months).
