As the Season of Easter comes to an End, we celebrate **the Day of Pentecost**. In Acts, Chapter 2, we hear **Peter's witness to Jesus** on the first Christian Pentecost.

"And Peter said to them, 'Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself.' And with many other words he bore witness" (vv. 38-40).

That first Pentecost marked the birth of the Christian Church and Christian Congregations. For 2,000 years people around the globe have witnessed to Jesus just as St Peter did on that first Pentecost.

"These stones will remind the people of what the Lord has done!" Joshua 4:6

When God parted the waters of the Jordan River to enable the people of Israel to cross safely into the promised land, Joshua selected 12 men, one from each tribe, to bring a stone to the opposite shore. A cairn was constructed. When someone, in the future, wondered what the stones meant, they were told of what the Lord had done for His people.

When moss rock was purchased for the altar, font, and pulpit, members were also asked to bring moss rocks to include in the construction. Many of the rocks that you see came from members. They serve as a reminder of all that God has done for the people of Mount Calvary. A friend of Mount Calvary, Leo Weber, made the beetle killed pine tops for the furnishings. Since the plain paneled walls looked out of place, workers added stained and varnished knotty pine boards to the chancel area and front walls. As plans were made for carpeting, another decision had to be made. Should the 63 year old hardwood pews be reinstalled and chairs be added to the annex? 36 new, cushioned pews, would cost \$16,222.00, an amount not included in the budget! It didn't take long to raise the extra amount and we are enjoying that decision still today.

After much more work, a dedication date was set for May 6, 1984. As trumpets sounded, members cut ribbons to the various areas of the remodeled sanctuary-nave. Among them, Rick and Peggy Pepmiller and their 2-1/2 year old daughter, Kimberly, cut the ribbon to the new cry room. By the way, Kimberly, as a nurse, will soon be on her way to South Africa as a medical missionary. Pastor Ralph Phipps, president of the Rocky Mountain District, preached the sermon with the theme, "What Do These Stones Mean?" He connected the 12 stones of Joshua's day to our moss rocks and the stories they tell.

The two larger moss rocks on the front of the baptismal font tell a special story. They were brought by Karl and Bev Ebel who were anticipating the baptism of their twin grandchildren. Cam and Shelly Marcoux (Ebel) were the first babies baptized at the new moss rock font.

These words of thanks at the end of dedication service sum up the story of how God works through His people: "Painting, staining, pies and cakes for workers, dusting, washing, siding, stooping, bending, sweating, varnishing, picking up trash, hauling to the dump, odd jobs and not so odd, puttying, lifting and everything else that needed doing — MANY VOLUNTEERS"!
