From the Pastor's Desk

"For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery. ... For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." [Gal. 5:1,13]

I was discussing our freedom as Americans with a young man the other day. He was of the opinion that we are in many ways slaves - to government, to employers, to the criminals, to other countries. It is interesting how people can have such disparate perceptions and perspectives. No one is absolutely free! Even God is bound by the nature of His character, His love, His promises. In terms of personal freedoms and liberty, it would be hard to find another time or place where common people have the kinds of rights and freedoms and privileges that every American has under our Constitution and laws.

All of this begins with the British people, their history of developing checks and balances and insisting upon personal liberties. How all of this occurred is in many respects a mysterious miracle, not at all likely, and something that didn't develop similarly in any other nation in the world. All concepts of personal freedom and liberty come from the development of these concepts in Great Britain. They also almost singularly forced the world to cease and desist the practice of slave trading and slave owning. It was Christians in Great Britain, Puritans first and then Anglicans, who ceaselessly pressed this morality on their own country, which was the largest slave trading and slave owning nation in the world.

Many people from the British empire came to America and helped build the country to what it is today. A lot of the original immigrants were quite poor and backward, and quite prone to vendetta and violence. Nonetheless, Americans also shared in "miracles" as our nation came together. First, that such a small population could thwart the will of the greatest Empire in world history, and win independence. Second, that we had enough intellectuals to craft a Constitution and Bill of Rights to guarantee us the freedoms we enjoy. Of course, those freedoms have had to be defended on many occasions, and our citizens have always had the courage and fortitude to defeat all enemies.

Our freedoms are very much based on the freedoms God has given us in Christ. The greatest freedom we have in Christ is from our sin, guilt, and condemnation, freedom to have fellowship with God and eternal life in heaven. We also have the freedom to turn away from the ways of the sinful flesh, and to serve one another in love. For the most part these freedoms have also been safeguarded to us by our Constitution and laws in America. If these Constitutional freedoms ever erode, it will also impact our Christian freedom, which in turn will further erode our concepts of personal rights and liberty. Much is at stake in what we hear and see going on around us in our nation. Vigilance is required, and much prayer, and a willingness to fight for the blessings God has given us in America.

It is good to be eager for improvement where necessary, but also important to be respectful and grateful for the huge blessedness we already enjoy. May we give thanks and praise to God as we celebrate our independence from England this month, but let us ever remember that we can never retain such blessedness if we choose to be independent from God.

Upheld by God's Hand, Mental Health Outreach -- LCMS Life Ministry \$96,500

Millions of people in the United States are suffering with mental illness and disorders. There is a tremendous need and opportunity for Lutheran outreach to help these people and their family members cope with mental illnesses. Research validates that people seeking help for mental disorders might be more likely to consult a pastor than a clinical therapist or psychologist. Pastors, church workers, and lay leaders must be prepared to address the mental health and illness issues that members of the congregation and those outside the church may bring to them. The LCMS Task Force for Mental Illness, Health, and Wellness is coordinating with LCMS Life Ministry to develop and publish materials and resources to provide training for church workers and lay leaders related to mental health outreach and spiritual care. This grant will support the development of these materials.
