

Created to be...witnesses (Part 2)

Week 6 (October 14th)

Key verse(s): “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.” – Acts 1:8

In Part 1, we agreed that witness work is difficult, so let’s learn from some of the witnesses in the Bible in order to train ourselves in this work.

Read Jonah (yep – the whole book)

To whom did the Lord send Jonah?

What did the Lord ask Jonah to say?

What was Jonah’s response?

What was the result?

Next, read Matthew 3 (again – all of it)

To whom did the Lord send John?

What did the Lord ask John to say?

What was John’s response?

What was the result (see also Matthew 4:12, and Matthew 14:1-12)?

Homework:

Complete this entire worksheet, even if we do not get to it in class.

For next week, we will be discussing specific ways in which we can be witnesses in our daily life. Various topics that we encounter may be of great interest to those around us. One item of interest these days is a vaccine for Covid-19. In at least 5 sentences describe what you have heard on that topic and how it might be a topic you can use to be a witness
