### A STATEMENT OF OUR PRACTICE OF CLOSE COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, Our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very Body and Blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins. 1 Corinthians 10:14ff. Our Lord invites to His table those who repent of all their sins and who trust His words, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Corinthians 11:29) and because Holy Communion is a confession of faith which is confessed at this altar, (1 Corinthians 10:15-18) any who are not yet instructed in this faith, who are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church Missouri-Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with one of the Pastors in his office prior to the service. Visitors who have previously spoken with one of the Pastors, and who received permission to commune, do not need to seek permission for subsequent visits to the altar.

Dear members of Mt. Calvary,

If I have my history correct, you will be witnessing a first for Mt. Calvary today. Several young Christians will be going through the "Rite of First Communion prior to Confirmation." This means that, although they are not yet confirmed, they will be receiving Communion along with the rest of us. Although this rite has not been used by Mt. Calvary before, it has been used by many other LCMS congregations, including my home congregation (Zion in Hopkins,



MN). Rest assured that they have been prepared and examined to determine their readiness for this momentous day. All of them know that they are receiving the true body and blood of Christ for the forgiveness of their sins. As St. Paul wrote to Timothy "let no one look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity." Finally, I would like to express my regret that other students did not get to participate in a special day like this and were not publicly recognized. This is our first full year going through the new Family Ministry program and therefore, our first time doing everything that we have laid out. Within the last few years, other students started receiving Communion as they were deemed ready, but they simply started going through the continuous line mostly unnoticed. If you are one of those students, please know that I rejoice with you just as much as I do these who will be recognized today.

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT: The Coming of the Christ Brings True Rejoicing in His Forgiveness When he preaches repentance, John the Baptist points us to Christ Jesus. John was sent by God "as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him" (John 1:7). He baptizes with water in order to "make straight the way of the Lord," who shall redeem His people from their sins (John 1:23). That Lord Jesus "who comes after" John now stands among us and makes Himself known to us (John 1:26–27). He has been anointed by the Holy Spirit "to bring good news to the poor" and "to bind up the brokenhearted" (Isaiah 61:1). By the washing of the water with His Word and Spirit, He clothes His Church with "the garments of salvation" and adorns her with His own righteousness "as a bride adorns herself with her jewels" (Isaiah 61:10). Therefore, we "rejoice always" in the Lord, "pray without ceasing" and "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thessalonians 5:16–18). For "the God of peace," who has called you by the Gospel, will surely "sanctify you completely," so that "your whole spirit and soul and body" will "be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Thessalonians 5:23–24).
