Summary of the LAW

- 1. What we are to do and not to do / be and not to be
- 2. S.O.S. Shows our sin and the wrath of God
- 3. Preached to all people, especially to those who do not repent (impenitent)

Summary of the GOSPEL

- 1. What God has done and still does for our salvation
- 2. S.O.S. Shows our Savior and the grace of God
- 3. Preached to troubled or repentant sinners

The LAW was given twice



First written in people's hearts. When Adam and Eve sinned= imperfect knowledge of Law

Second, written on stone tablets on Mt. Sinai


Three kinds of Law in the O. T.

- 1. Moral Law (1st in hearts / 2nd in 10 commandments)
- 2. Ceremonial Law
- 3. Political Law


