**LWML is planning to assemble School Kits** for Lutheran World Relief. We would invite the entire congregation to participate by donating items for the kits.

The children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. When parents can only afford to send one of their children to school, girls rarely get priority....yet the education level of mothers has the biggest impact on development.

Each kit will contain the following:

- 4-70 sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper
- 1-30 centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- 1- Pencil sharpener
- 1-blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 1-Box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 5-Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- 5-Black or blue ball point pens (no gel ink)
- 1- 2/12 inch eraser

We plan to assemble School Kits on Wednesday, August 26th, at 5:00 p.m. in the Activities Center. There is a box in the Fellowship Hall and by the Activities Center for your donations.

Anyone interested may come and help assemble the kits.
