SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY: The Lord God Is with You and Reveals Himself to You by the Preaching of His Word The Lord Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael to "come and see" that He is "the Son of God" and "the King of Israel" (John 1:43-49). And they shall see even "greater things than these" (John 1:50). For His body is the temple of God on earth, and by His priestly sacrifice the heavens will be opened to all who believe and are baptized into Him. Therefore, He calls Philip and Nathanael, first to hear His Word and then to speak as apostles, even as He once called Samuel and established him "as a prophet of the LORD" (1 Samuel 3:20). As the Lord was with Samuel "and let none of his words fall to the around" (1 Samuel 3:19), He also accompanies and upholds the preachers of His Word in our day. Thus, by the Gospel that is preached to you, "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you" (1 Corinthians 6:19). Since your body thus belongs to the Body of Christ, is meant "for the Lord" and shall be raised up like Him, now "glorify God in your body" (1 Corinthians 6:13–20).

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study: Each year, we as Christians revisit the life and work of Christ by observing the various seasons. We start with Advent, which brings us back to the Old Testament and the waiting for the Messiah. At Christ-God's Word mas, we celebrate God's promise being kept in the incarnation and in Epiphany, we recognize God's promise as being for all people, including the Gentiles. Through Lent and Holy Week, we prepare ourselves to receive the sacrifice of



Christ for our sins and on Easter, we joyously shout that Jesus is risen to give us eternal life. However, the vast majority of the Church year is spent in "common time" or the season after Pentecost. Over twenty Sundays are meant to help us reflect on the work of the Holy Spirit through the disciples in the early church and the work that the Spirit is still doing through us today. To that end, we will now be studying the Book of Acts, which chronicles the work of the Spirit in the early Church. Although we are endlessly familiar with the Gospels and the epistles of Paul, we may find that we have more to learn about this fascinating book. We invite you to join us! In Christ, Pastor Kevin

Dear Family Ministry students and parents,

The 8th grade and above class resumed meeting on January 10th. The group will meet 3 more times, including a review session on January 31st. Following that review session, they will have the

opportunity to take the test the next week or by appointment when they feel they are adequately prepared. Upon passing the test, they will complete their faith statement and schedule a time for an interview.

The 6th and 7th grade class met with Roger Kropuenske on January 10th, but this was their last formal class until after Easter. In the meantime, the 6th and 7th graders will be working on memory work. They received a list of 24 Bible passages that every Christian should know. Of those 24, they are to pick 12 verses to recite perfectly to Pastor Kevin. They are to complete all their memory work before classes resume on April 7th. To keep pace, 2 verses per week is recommended. They may recite these verses on Wednesday evenings at 6:15, Sunday mornings after each service, or by appointment during the week. During the regular class time on Wednesday evenings, there will be a Memory Work Study Hall in the Board Room. You may choose to use that time to work on flashcards with other students, siblings, parents, or other adults before reciting to Pastor Kevin in his office starting at 6:15. You may also choose to study at home if you prefer.
