A STATEMENT OF OUR PRACTICE OF CLOSE COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, Our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very Body and Blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins. 1 Corinthians 10:14ff. Our Lord invites to His table those who repent of all their sins and who trust His words, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Corinthians 11:29) and because Holy Communion is a confession of faith which is confessed at this altar, (1 Corinthians 10:15-18) any who are not yet instructed in this faith, who are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church Missouri-Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with one of the Pastors in his office prior to the service. Visitors who have previously spoken with one of the Pastors, and who received permission to commune, do not need to seek permission for subsequent visits to the altar.

Dear members of Mt. Calvary,

Today, two young Christians will be going through the "Rite of First Communion prior to Confirmation." This means that, although they are not yet confirmed, they will be receiving Communion along with the rest of us. Although this rite has not been used frequently in our congregation, it has been used by many other LCMS congregations, including my home congregation (Zion in Hopkins, MN). Rest assured that they have



been prepared and examined to determine their readiness for this momentous day. Both of them know that they are receiving the true body and blood of Christ for the forgiveness of their sins. As St. Paul wrote to Timothy "let no one look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity." Finally, I would like to express my regret that other students did not get to participate in a special day like this and were not publicly recognized. This is our first full year going through the new Family Ministry program and therefore, our first time doing everything that we have laid out. Within the last few years, other students started receiving Communion as they were deemed ready, but they simply started going through the continuous line mostly unnoticed. If you are one of those students, please know that I rejoice with you just as much as I do these who will be recognized today.

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY: The Lord Calls Us to Himself by the Preaching of Repentance in His

Name When "the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time," sending him to preach judgment against the great city of Nineveh, "Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD" (Jonah 3:1, 3). By this preaching, the people were brought to repentance. Because they "believed God," as He spoke to them through His prophet, "they turned from their evil way" and were spared "the disaster that he had said he would do to them" (Jonah 3:5, 10). St. Paul also warns that "the appointed time has grown very short" (1 Corinthians 7:29). Therefore, while we live in this world and deal with it, we are not to cling to it, nor put our trust in it, for "the present form of this world is passing away" (1 Corinthians 7:31). Rather, give "your undivided devotion to the Lord" (1 Corinthians 7:35). When our Lord Jesus Christ comes and is proclaimed in the Gospel, "the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand" (Mark 1:14–15). Therefore, He still calls men and sends them to become "fishers of men" with the net of that Gospel (Mark 1:17).

Dear Family Ministry students and parents,

The 8th grade and above class resumed meeting on January 10th. The group will meet 2 more times, including a review session on January 31st. Following that review session, they will have the

opportunity to take the test the next week or by appointment when they feel they are adequately prepared. Upon passing the test, they will complete their faith statement and schedule a time for an interview.

The 6th and 7th grade class met with Roger Kropuenske on January 10th, but this was their last formal class until after Easter. In the meantime, the 6th and 7th graders will be working on memory work. They received a list of 24 Bible passages that every Christian should know. Of those 24, they are to pick 12 verses to recite perfectly to Pastor Kevin. They are to complete all their memory work before classes resume on April 7th. To keep pace, 2 verses per week is recommended. They may recite these verses on Wednesday evenings at 6:15, Sunday mornings after each service, or by appointment during the week. During the regular class time on Wednesday evenings, there will be a Memory Work Study Hall in the Board Room. You may choose to use that time to work on flashcards with other students, siblings, parents, or other adults before reciting to Pastor Kevin in his office starting at 6:15. You may also choose to study at home if you prefer.
